









# "30th Birthday Celebrations

# Rotary Club of West Pennant Hills & Cherrybrook"



The Club was chartered on the 8th May 1987 with 26 members. Charter President was Trevor Turner, who was later to become the Club's first Paul Harris Fellow.

The Rotary Club of Beecroft was the Mother Club under the guidance of mentor, Past President Ken Wonson, who led the club through the difficult early days. Of the charter members inducted only four were serving Rotarians.

From the start it was a young and energetic club, membership focussed on serving the community. Early projects were community based, and in Australia's Bicentenary Year of 1988, the Club constructed a Wishing Well on a former historic site in the grounds of West Pennant Hills Public School complete with time capsule.

As a young club we reached our target for Polio Plus (\$4,000,00) and donated a Talking Book Machine to the Royal Blind Society. Our Youth Exchange program was working well

with student Andrew Handley in Japan, and Gretchen Hill coming from America. The club conducted its first Plant Sale and night out at "The Burning Log" (fundraiser). We supported the Salvation Army Red Shield Appeal, The Merrymakers Group, the Royal Blind Society and the Mission to Seamen book and magazine "round up". We made Pride of Workmanship Awards to Mrs Lorelle Shelley of West Pennant Hills, telephone counsellor and President of Nursing Mothers Association, and Mr Bill Pinfold, from Hills Menswear in Thorby Arcade.

SPEAKER- Jim Mein "Give Peace A Chance"

This was a Study Tour of Israel and Palestine in January 2017 (15-26). A group of 22 persons was to experience & understand what is behind it all in Israel-Palestine. This was a particular style of Tour with a company 'Breaking Bread Journeys'. It is a joint Israeli-Palestinian tour project that builds bridges by "breaking bread". This tailor-made tour immersed travellers into the culture through unique daily "breaking bread" experiences. Co-founders of this tour project are Christina Samara, a Palestinian and Elisa Moed, an Israeli who bring a combined 50 years of tourism experience to this unique tourism venture.



On this Jewish Community- Uniting Church Study Tour, they interviewed 53 people and met a varied range of people. The focus was meeting & working together with these people to understand and come to grips with the issues that are preventing peace. Also to

understand the work/projects that are being done at grassroots and the people involved. It involved visiting places, projects and meeting with these people. Some interesting people the Group met and interacted with included the following:

Sulaiman Khatib and Raphael Nabhlz, Combatants for Peace

Dr Mustafa Barghouti, Palestinian Relief Society, Ramallah

Dr Mohammad Shtayyeh, Minister, Palestinian Economic Council for Development

It was an inspiring and eye opening talk by Jim over a myriad of colliding issues and challenges for Peace in Israel-Palestine. There are many Narratives to the present problems and Barriers to Peace-making. There is also the undeniable disparity between Israelis & Palestians. With that there is the challenge to cooperation and how to get grass-roots programmes to achieve peace.

As a result of this Study Tour, it has been decided that this Group will promote active involvement in three grass-roots projects - EcoPeace, Road to Recovery and the Tagheer Movement.
