REPORT FROM LAST WEEK

Our 42nd Pride of Workmanship Awards Presentation

Phil Stanton as Chairman opened the meeting welcoming everyone and then introduced President Pam Hudson. Pam initiated grace and the nice food arrived. Everyone enjoyed fellowship until 8 pm and Theo Glockemann spoke about the upcoming Red Shield Appeal appealing for volunteers at the static collection points before the large scale door knocking appeal on Sunday 28th May 2017.

After everyone had their tea or coffee President Pam introduced our guest speaker Russell Zimmerman the Executive Director of the Australian Retailers Association. Russell spoke very candidly about his role and his experiences with retail over the years. The impact of weekend penalty rates cannot be ignored in the Australian retailing context, keeping enough staff on duty to provide adequate customer service is always balanced against the organisations bottom line.

Russell went on to say that employees are all too often noticed for making mistakes, and go unnoticed for good work where extra effort was involved and an excellent customer experience resulted. Russel told us a couple of his personal shopping experience when an irreversible wardrobe malfunction occurred and a new suite was required before a television interview the next day. Russell relayed very bad and very good experience within the one shop when buying a replacement Hugo Boss suite.



Before Russell became the Executive Director of the Australian Retailers Association he told us of an excellent shopping experience with Country Road. Russell was able to ensure the employees received recognition for their good retail efforts. Russell did note that the Rotary Club of Pennant Hills initiated pride of workmanship awards in 1976 as a mechanism where employers could publicly acknowledge outstanding employees.

David Firth then commenced the formal awards commencing with Nicole Bondoc, Banna Property Group, Jessie Ding, By-Dezign Pty Ltd, Susan Jones Deputy Principal St Lucy's School, Sam Sardana

Each recipient was congratulated by President Pam and Russell Zimmerman and then given their POW Award plaque. Each recipient posed for photographs and were asked to take the awards to work tomorrow for others to view.

Nicole Bondoc, speaking on behalf of all the awardees, thanked the employers and the Rotary Club of Pennant Hills for organising this year's POW Awards.

President Pam then closed the meeting by thanking all our guests, particularly our awardees, for coming and inviting everyone to join in singing the National Anthem.


This was followed by a very pleasant time of fellowship and a chance to personally congratulate each of the awardees. A fitting end to another great Pride of Workmanship Awards presentation.
