REPORT FROM LAST MEETING ON JUNE 5th

President Pam opened the meeting and outlined the arrangements for the Changeover on Monday 19th June, and confirmed the allocation of duties on the night. It was requested that all attending advise their numbers to David Firth by the 10th June.

The President also advised of a meeting with parents from the Central Coast who had children at St Lucy's School and were concerned at the new increased costs involved in getting their children to the school as a result of the incoming changes to the new NDIS rules.

The Project Director advised that as a result of an approach by Nicole Bondoc of Banna Property Group (a recent POW awardee), and our contact a Pennant Hills Market Place, she has been able to arrange for 8 kilos of steak and 8 kilos of thin sausages to be donated free of charge by IGA at Pennant Hills to the Ronald McDonald House "Meals From The Heart" night on Wednesday 28th June.

The Project Director also advised that he had been contacted by Jennifer Smith of RYDA, advising that Mount St Benedicts Girls School would be attending the RYDA Program at Sydney Olympic Park on Friday 15th September. It was noted that we did not have much involvement with the school, but John Ellis advised that they did participate in the National Youth Science School. It was decided to try and have a team of 6 members to assist the school on their day at RYDA.

President Pam read a letter, which had been prepared by PP Theo, addressed to the Principal of Pennant Hills High School, outlining our extreme disappointment at the lack of collectors from the school (none) at the recent Red Shield Door Knock Appeal on Sunday 28th May. It was agreed that the school response to this project had been very disappointing over the last few years and it was decided to forward the letter.

PP Adrian Bell gave a full report on the "Big Day Out", held on Sunday 4th June. Seventeen people joined the road trip which included a ferry trip at Sackville, a wine tasting at Tizzana Winery and a visit to the Ebeneezer Church, the oldest surviving church in Australia, followed by an inspection of gravesites there, a Devonshire Tea and an interesting talk (in the church) on the early settlers in the area. Well done Adrian.

Sergeant Terry was then let loose on the unsuspecting members, including those celebrating their anniversaries - Peter Wilson 32 years & Phil Stanton 33 years - and those members who had not yet supplied their annual reports to David Firth.

Following the tea/coffee break, PP Theo played a video which had been produced by Eddie Pinto during the 2016 RYLA in Timor Leste. The video featured interviews with the students highlighting their aims and ambitions as a result of their participation in the RYLA program. It is difficult for many of us to understand what an achievement it is to be selected for the program. There were 650 applicants for the 85 positions, plus 15 facilitators.



The RYLA program enables the cream of the young people of Timor Leste to meet and discuss a wide range of issues confronting their country and gives them the opportunity to address issues of training, leadership, finance, health, farming, agriculture and spiritual issues. The course is conducted over 1 week and greatly assists the young people to train themselves and to do it for their country. The project supported by our club, also includes a RYPEN component over a weekend for the younger boys and girls of school leaving age. This program also assists in preparing the younger generation to help their country develop.

Well done Theo! I am sure that most of the people in Timor Leste appreciate your commitment and enthusiasm.

Report from the Rotary International Annual Conference just completed in Atlanta, Georgia, USA

With polio on the brink of eradication, nations from around the world and key donors pledged more than \$1 billion on Monday to energize the global fight to end the paralyzing disease. Bill Gates, co-chair of The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and RI President John Germ share the recent news about their partnership in the fight to eradicate polio.

The historic pledges of new funds at the Rotary Convention in Atlanta, Georgia, USA, will go toward drastically shrinking the **\$1.5 billion** gap in the funding that the partners of the **Global Polio Eradication Initiative** say is needed to reduce polio cases to zero worldwide. Just five cases have been reported this year, the lowest number in history.

Bill Gates, co-chair of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, said ending polio would be one of the world's greatest achievements.

"Polio is the thing I spend the most time on. Everyday I look at my email to see if we have a new case," Gates said. "I'm very inspired to be part of this. I'm also very humbled."

Rotary International President John F. Germ announced that Rotary would increase its commitment and raise \$50 million per year over the next three years. Rotary has raised more than \$1.7 billion to fight the disease since 1985.

"Right now, every time a new case is identified, it really could be the last one the world ever sees," Germ said.

Gates told the crowd of nearly 24,000 that, starting 1 July, his **foundation** will extend its 2-to-1 match to cover up to \$50 million in donations to Rotary for each of the next three years. The match and donations to Rotary would add up to \$150 million per year over the next three years, which will add up to \$450 million to the fight.

The new funding will go toward polio eradication efforts such as disease surveillance, responses to any outbreaks, and the vaccination of more than 400 million children annually.
