

Creswell John Eastman AM is the Clinical Professor of Medicine at Sydney University Medical School, Principal of the Sydney Thyroid Clinic and Consultant Emeritus to the Westmead Hospital. Eastman is an endocrinologist and has directed or conducted research and public health projects into elimination of iodine deficiency disorders (IDD) in Malaysia, Indonesia, Laos, Cambodia, Thailand, several Pacific Islands, Hong Kong, China and Tibet and Australia. For his work in remote areas of China, he has been dubbed the "man who saved a million brains".

In 2007, Professor Eastman was our club's Australia Day Merit Awardee.

This means that we need to elect another member as the incoming president for 2018-19. President Alex would be delighted to receive any offers or nominations as soon as possible.


