Meeting Report - 9th October, 2017

President Alex opened the meeting and welcomed the two lost souls from Timor, Theo and Jim. He also recognised Julie MacDonald from PKU who had been very busy arranging auction prizes and gifts for next weeks' Charity Golf Day at Pennant Hills on Tuesday 17th October.

John Ellis advised that the club had 2 candidates for the National Youth Science Forum and they were contacting the Mayor of Hornsby to try to obtain funding from the Hornsby Youth Trust Fund.

Theo reported that the visit to Timor was another blast and he was pleased to see the progress that some of the former students had made in their work and the education of other young people. He promised over a thousand pictures to share in the presentation on 23 October.

Ian Chappel encouraged everyone to participate in the Hat Night for Rotary Health, in the "Lift The Lid" program on 30th October. It was noted that the Golf Club would not be available on this night, and a decision on the alternative venue would be made soon.

David Firth provided the list of selling dates for the Trailer Raffle, and asked members to fill in their available days on the draft roster. The Annual Christmas Trailer Raffle starts at Pennant Hills on Saturday 14th October and continues for the next 10 weeks at Thornleigh, Westleigh (new venue), Coonara, Hornsby, West Pymble, Cherrybrook, West Pennant Hills, Thornleigh and the final day at Pennant Hills on 16th December. The draw will be at the Golf Club at 1 pm on Sunday 17th December. David also advised that Alan and Lee Lowe had volunteered to assist and Alan had a tow bar. It was noted that the trailer was now built and the gifts would be collected from Bunnings Dural on Thursday 12th October.

Sergeant Theo, as usual, relieved almost everyone of their 'hard earned', and there were more protests of "not guilty" than usually heard at the Supreme Court. All protests were summarily dismissed and the fines were reluctantly paid.

Following the coffee break, Golf Day chairman Phil reported that everything was proceeding for another successful golf day on Tuesday 17th October. He expected over 80 players and they had received a number of gold sponsors as well as other hole sponsors. It was noted that there would be an auction of items, as well as raffles, and betting would be conducted on the 9th Hole, for" Nearest The Pin", with prizes paid in raffle tickets.

The golf prizes would include winner of a 2 ball team, a singles prize, Longest Drive for both men and women, nearest the pin on all par 3s (except) the 9th hole.

It was noted that a number of members would assist with the running of the day including, President Alex, Pam, Theo, Ian, Jim and John. All members were requested to be at the Golf Club early in the morning, as breakfast was being served from 7 am, with registration from 7.30 am and the Shot Gun Starting Time was 8.30 am.

- (1) a three piece Garden Setting-valued at \$250,
- (2) a Jumbuck Barbecue (Webber) shape valued at \$150, and
- (3) a fire engine red coloured wheelbarrow (which matches the colour of the Trailer -valued at \$120. Not a bad \$500 plus donation!

We purchased a line trimmer \$139; an Esky \$46.98; 8 bags of mulch \$119.20; and 2 bags of potting mix \$7.90 - a total of \$ 313.08.
