

Rotary Meeting - Monday 11th December, 2017

Opened by President Alex Thomas with warm greetings.

First report by John Ellis to advise that he had attended the Pennant Hills High School awards night where there were 6 leadership awards given out on behalf of Pennant Hills Rotary in support of the schools request. Ian Chappel was extolling his virtues at the recent sale of raffle tickets where he encouraged a new member to join us in the new year.

David Firth outlined the success of the weekend's trailer raffle sale at Thornleigh and advised the last day for sales would be Saturday 16th. As there is a major event at the shopping centre, the hours are to be extended to 3pm to take advantage of the centre's Christmas draw and hopefully increased traffic of potential ticket buyers.

The 'Tree of Joy' is progressing well, with the first delivery to Stewart House on Thursday by Pat, Jack and David with a follow up to Parramatta Mission the following week. Westpac has been very supportive by looking after the gifts donated by our generous community. The bank staff clear the gifts each day.

Theo then got stuck into the Sargeant's role with John being his main target for his inability to answer history questions as well as selling a full book of tickets to one person without sharing the sale with others or giving the buyer any bonus tickets for such a large donation; David for lounging in a big chair while collecting money; Adrian for his dress sense; and Jack for drinking Theo's coffee at the recent trailer sales. Jack raised a concern about people not calling to let the club know they would not be able to attend Monday meetings such that it was costing the club for extra meals. Members need to phone our club answering service before midday on Saturdays to register apologies or advise of guests coming to our meeting.

The Pennant Hills Rotary AGM then commenced:

- 1) As there was a number of members away, it was first questioned if there was enough people to form a quorum. It was confirmed there was, so the meeting went forward. The minutes from the previous AGM were circulated and discussed and there was a note made that the revised constitution and by laws had not been discussed and ratified which would need to be put on next years agenda. The minutes were verified as read.
- 2) The Financial report was circulated and thanks given to David for taking up the role after Peter Wilson's departure. David went through the components of the report outlining the financial position of the club and outlined a slight difference in Pride of Workmanship outlining that revenues where down over previous years. He also outlined the requirement for the report to be audited by an qualified individual which he would seek out.
- 3) Elections for next year then commenced:

Opened with President for 2018-17: The nomination was Adrian Bell who was elected. Adrian stated that he was going to focus on Club activities, while others could be involved with District and Rotary International matters.

Vice President : Alex Thomas was elected.

President Elect for 2019-20: Jim Fraser was elected.

Secretary: Jim Fraser was elected.

Treasurer: David Firth agreed to continue unless Pam Hudson would take on the role.

Directors: The following were elected - John Ellis, Pat Parker, Phil Stanton, Theo Glockemann, Ian Chappel, David Firth and Pam Hudson. The portfolios to be confirmed by Adrian as president elect.

General Business -

Ahmadul Ameen is proposed as a new member by Phil Stanton. It was suggested by President Alex and that he be inducted as the next meeting if available.

The Christmas gathering is to take place on Monday 18th at Lutanda Manor Leisure Centre with a BBQ. Members and partners are reminded that it is BYO drinks.

David, as treasurer, spoke of paying accounts by direct deposit rather than by cheques. Adrian advised that there were options where the direct deposit was created by one club signatory and then digitally went to the next signatory before payment was made. David is to contact the bank to have this set up.

As there was no further business, the meeting closed at 8:40pm.

Last Thursday saw the delivery of the first load of gifts from the 'Tree of Joy' at Pennant Hills Market Place. Led by Projects Director Pat Parker, gifts were sorted at Westpac Bank by Jack Reid, Pat and David Firth, assisted by members of the bank staff. They already had about 5 shopping trolleys filled with gifts in storage for us. We headed off to Stewart House with about 90 gifts for children aged between 10 and 14 years. The number of gifts had been supplemented by gifts received through Ray White Real Estate's 'Little Ray of Giving' trees at their Pennant Hills office and at Thornleigh West Public School. We were welcomed on arrival at Stewart House as their final group of children were preparing to head home. These children were from the Broken Hill area and down to the Victoria/South Australian border. MD Graeme Philpotts and CEO Murray O'Donnell came out to receive the gifts and to express their thanks to us and to the Pennant Hills community. We managed to get a photo of Graeme with our stalwart Jack with the great pile of gifts.
