REPORT OF LAST WEEK'S MEETING

With President Alex involved elsewhere, the 'Big Kahunah' Adrian took the reins. Lucky for him our racing guru, PP Pat was also absent! It was indeed a very relaxed evening.

PP Theo provided a very comprehensive report on his and Georgia's visit to the open house at the new Ronald McDonald House at Westmead. The new house is built behind the old one at 1 Labyrinth Way, Westmead. Theo learned that the old house had 18 rooms plus 5 units and was capable of accommodating 600 families a year. Sadly, in 2017, over 400 families were unable to be accommodated, hence the need for the larger facility. The new house can support more than 1,360 families each year with the first families moving in this week. It has been dubbed 'The House That Love Built'. In the new house, most rooms can accommodate 6-8

people, with a number of additional interconnecting rooms providing for bigger family groups.

Theo reported that they are still very keen for our club to be involved in providing a meal for families resident there. The way in which that will be handled has changed which may make the organisation easier, however they believe we should have at least 20 volunteers to prepare the meal and share with the resident families.

PP Ian Chappel spoke about supporting Mary Stoddart, a relative of Terry Pankhurst, who is planning to swim the English Channel this English summer as a fundraiser for PKU research. Mary has entered in the Rottnest Channel Swim this weekend, which is some sort of qualifying event for a Channel swim attempt.

Ian has been in touch with Peter White, president of the Rotary Club of Beckenham in UK to see if they are interested in supporting Mary's bid and her fundraising effort for PKU research.

Following the buffet dinner, an established meal format now, Sergeant Theo was let loose. He had prepared a somewhat contrived application of those members present to some of the Winter Olympic Games disciplines. How did he manage to assign Jack Reid to the bobsled team? And yours truly to the Luge? It was notable that he failed to assign a discipline to himself although he would no doubt have chosen Curling provided he could pass the drug test! Then we had PP Pam Hudson own up to the fact that she is in training for the next Summer Games having purchased a new paddle for her canoe - it's really a kayak.

Adrian then led a discussion on membership and sought comments on how we might go about recruiting new members for Rotary and our club. A comment was made that one of the key points taken from Anne Wright's talk last week was the effort she and the Beecroft Club have made to connect with the community in Beecroft and the business community in particular. There seemed to be general agreement that we need to do likewise in Pennant Hills.

Theo asserted that the first and most pressing requirement for us to project our club and ourselves in the community is new club shirts. Our current shirts are many years old; none of our recent members have them; and those shirts still surviving are looking pretty shabby. It was agreed that we should investigate new polo style club shirts as soon as possible.

It was agreed that we should try an information booth at the Pennant Hills Market Place. This would require permission from the Banna Group; a suitable location; suitable times, both weekends and mid week; a club brochure; business cards; a register of interested people; suitable display materials; and a roster of available members to man the booth. The requirements need to be addressed as a priority.
