MEETING REPORT 21st MAY

Theo called on the President Alex, who unfortunately had to turn down an invitation to preside over a very high profile wedding in the UK last Saturday to open the meeting. Theo welcomed our visitor Peter Taylor from the Rotary Club of Sheppey, Kent south east of London.

Professor John Christodoulou arrived just before the directors reports.

President Alex called for director reports; Ian Chappel reported that the everydayhero fundraiser had reached \$3560.00 but was still increasing. Pat Parker advised that the annual visit to Ronald MacDonald House was schedules for the 13th June 2018. Club members would provide food and talk to the guests to help them through their difficult time. David Firth advised that the Pride of Workmanship night was scheduled for the 4th June 2018. The night would cost \$40.00 per person.

Visiting Rotarian Peter Taylor was asked by President Alex to introduce himself. Peter said he belonged to the Isle of Sheppey Rotary Club which is an 80 year old and has about 20 members. Peter's profession was Chartered Accountant.

The Sergeant's Session was next with Theo at it again! He thought that Terry Pankhurst and family had been at the Royal wedding as Terry was absent last week and was thought to be heading to the UK by boat.

Theo gave President Alex a merit fine for turning down the offer to conduct the service at the Royal wedding.

Theo fined Pam for having a bushranger as a distant relative, even though the Sergeant offered no proof for the accusation.

Theo fined Ian Huckel for being a former banker and hiding his fine money under his serviette.

Theo fined Ian Chappel and suggested that for a body with fine physique, that would attract money for the English Channel swim.

David Firth was fined for going to the Rugby.

Claude was fined for not knowing about Phil's "hole-in-one" last week. Mrs Stanton was asked to pay the fine for Phil.

Pat cross-fined the preacher for going over time at such an important event as the Royal wedding.

Someone mentioned that Theo should put on his swimsuit to attract funding for the English Channel swim. This was thought by all as too much information and it was time to terminate the fine session as the club had already lost too much dignity.

Professor John Christodoulou was introduced by Terry Pankhurst. Terry reported that the club had supported PKU research financially for 10 years mainly through the golf days. Julie, his daughter, used to organise the dinner dances for the PKU Association as another fund raising activity.

Professor John Christodoulou started his talk and said it was a pleasure to be here. For PKU suffers, a careful diet, though onerous, can have a good outcome.

The PKU research has taken 10 years designing a probiotic diet which would process the phenylanaline which is the problem for PKU suffers. In the beginning this research was unique, but now there are four other teams working in a similar vein. One company with a budget of \$10m is expected to begin clinical trials in the US soon.

Professor John has not given up - the work is now focusing on improving the pro-biotic by redesigning it to be more effective than the mouse developed formula. A commercial arrangement with Cycle Pharma is commencing soon. They work on research projects like this and soon it will be known what seed money they will provide for the next phase. We are waiting to hear from them.

Two other areas of help for PKU suffers is occurring at Westmead Children's hospital. The researcher Minal, is taking a close look at repurposing existing drugs hoping to identify the PKU sufferers who would best benefit from those drugs.

The other approach is precision medicines "on steroids".

A US company has a different approach and wanted to know how to best conduct patient trials in Australia. The FDA in the US are keen and want the company to perform the trials on adults not children. Michael Chan is supporting adults with PKU at Westmead. Westmead could become the Australian site for adult trials. It would then take a couple of years before trials for children could begin.

Professor John was asked how many babies were born in Australia with PKU. He said around 30 per year - the ratio is one in 10,000 births in Australia. Some countries have higher rates, with Ireland and Turkey having about 1 in 3,000.

The only research with pro biotics in Australia is at Westmead hospital.

A pilot program by the Federal Government is to test 10,000 couples before they have children for over 100 genetic conditions. If the results of this work has benefits for those involved it may be extended as it is expensive to perform.

Andrew MacDonald thanked the continuing efforts and support from the Rotary Club of Pennant Hills. Andrew recalled bringing bags and bags of toilet rolls into the hospital and people were wondering why he wasn't going to the rubbish tip instead. The toilet rolls remain the favourite for the mouse population of between 3,000 and 5,000. The collection of the toilet rolls saves the hospital \$10,000 per year.

President Alex presented Professor Christodoulou with a \$20,000 cheque, proceeds of our Charity Golf Day last year. It was then passed to Andrew MacDonald for the PKU Association.

President Alex thanked the Professor and closed an excellent meeting.
