EAST TIMOR WATER AND SANITATION PROJECT

Presentation by

ROTARIAN BARRY ANDERSON (NORTHBRIDGE ROTARY CLUB)

In 2010 our Club (through President Richard Green) participated with Northbridge Rotary Club in a very successful joint project to construct a new building for teacher training in the Manufahi District of East Timor for The Catholic Dioceses of Parramatta & Broken Bay.

The Teacher Training Centre has now been handed over to the Timorese after over 10 years of training hundreds of local teachers.


Barry, who has been in involved in projects in East Timor for many years, will be speaking to us tonight about a project to construct water tanks and sanitation for both a high School of 700 students (with dormitories) and for the village market place at Ermera (about 2 hours drive from Dili) for a project cost of about US\$35,000.

Our Club will contribute A\$5,000 with a view to joining with Northbridge Rotary Club in funding a Global Grant application to be lodged shortly for funding from The Rotary Foundation.

Barry and two other Northbridge Rotarians have recently returned from East Timor after visiting the project site. They also visited another Northbridge water and sanitation project completed in July last year at Letefoho (3 hours drive from Dili) for 3 schools, the village market place and a medical centre which was also funded by a Global Grant.

Greetings from Sikkim in the foothills of the Himalayas at 7,000feet.

NEXT MEETING - 27 NOVEMBER 2018

Our guest speaker for the 27th November is Father Christopher Gardiner who is a [virtually] retired Franciscan priest who will be talking about his posting to St. Petersburg, Russia for 7 years. His talk is something different.

Though Father Gardiner has had 62 years of religous life and 55 of those years in the priesthood, it will not be a religious talk.

His topic will probably be "Seven years in St Petersburg".

Father Gardiner was born in Paddington, spent his primary education in West Wyalong and Bowral, before attending secondary education at Waverley College.

Father Christopher Gardiner studied at Waverley College with Norm Gibson but their occupations went in opposite directions after they finished the Leaving Certificate and left school. Christopher became a Franciscan priest. Norm ????? (no prizes for the best answer).

Christopher studied a variety of subjects at the University of Queensland, James Cook University of North Queensland at Townsville and the University of South Australia, obtained a B.A. degree and became registered as a Psychologist in South Australia, New South Wales and Victoria.

He has had various interesting Australian and international postings during his career as a priest including 5 years in the Holy Land, Israel and 2 years in Rome.

On 27 November he will speak about his 7 years as a priest with the Franciscan Foundation in St. Petersburg, Russia. He arrived alone on 28 November 2008, in a communist country with its harsh weather, speaking and writing virtually no Russian and knowing no one. Certainly a challenging start.

In 2016 Father Gardiner returned to Australia.

LAST MEETING - 23 0CT0BER 2018 Prof Philip O'Connell - Organ and Tissue Donation

Organ and Tissue Donation.

We were very fortunate to hear Professor O'Connell, an international expert on organ transplant research, speak to us on the critical need for organ and tissue donations.

Professor O'Connell is the Director of Transplantation at Westmead Hospital and a past President of the international body - The Transplantation Society.

Significantly, over 1500 Australians are awaiting transplants and about 11,000 Australians are on kidney dialysis.

The much improved procedures for informing donors and their families as to what will be involved, and the benefits to recipients, if a decision to donate takes effect have greatly improved the rate of family consent to transplants at the time of the brain death of a donor.

The consent is given in over 90% of cases where the donor has informed their family of his or her decision at the time of registration with the Organ and Tissue Authority. Sadly, without registration and prior family discussion, the rate of family consent at the time of brain death is about 40%.

Registration of a declaration of the decision to donate is achieved by the simple process of lodgement online (donatelife.gov.au or donorregister.gov. au), or by mail, of a concise two page form.

Australian Rotary, at its national conference in Hobart in September 2018, has decided to support the Donate Life Campaign through our Clubs promoting donor registration in their communities. Each year the Rotary Donate Life Committee will provide to all the Clubs, through the District Governor Elect, a press release to be issued immediately before Donate Life Week at the end of July each year.

Prior to the meeting we received a message from Sarah Gregory. We remember Julian as an outstanding Rotarian and good friend who was our President in 2012-2013.

"I would love to have come but am not able. For your information, Julian was a bone tissue and eye donor. We are so proud that Julian was able to leave a legacy in this small way given the sudden and tragic circumstances of his death. We had all discussed this and we all knew this was what Julian wanted. A last act of generosity and humanity. I cannot encourage everyone enough to talk about this and to consider this gift."

Many thanks to Professor O'Connell and his wife Belinda for giving up their valuable time to come to our meeting and to Sarah for her message to us.

What is Movember?

Movember is an annual charity event that takes place across the month of November, where men grow a moustache to raise funds and awareness for men's health projects.

It targets the most prominent health issues faced by men: prostate cancer, testicular cancer, mental health and suicide prevention.

Since Movember first started in Australia in 2003, the foundation has grown to fund more than 1,200 men's health initiatives across more than 20 countries. It is the only charity to tackle men's health on a global scale.

The problem

On average, men die six years earlier than women. Tragically, the leading cause of death for Australian men is suicide. Three out of four suicides are committed by men — that's more than half a million men taking their own life each year, or one man every minute.

The rate of prostate cancer is set to double in the next 15 years, and the rate of testicular cancer has already doubled over the past 50 years. It's a global crisis faced by our brothers, fathers, partners and friends.

And this is where Movember comes in.

The solution

The Movember Foundation finds and funds the most innovative research for both global and local impact. On a global scale, the Foundation has established the largest ever international alliance of researchers and health experts.

With a strong collaborative mindset, they are striving to avoid the duplication of work and deliver innovation and knowledge sharing.



This, in turn, is leading to an acceleration of results in diagnosis and treatment for men in Australia, and around the world. They also campaign to bring the facts to men on a global scale, create services that work, listen to the community and change behaviour for the better. Around the world, more than \$80 million was raised for men's health last year alone.

Grow a Mo:

Men, the only way to become a true 'Mo Bro' is to start November cleanshaven and then let your upper lip sprout unrestrained. And why not get your mates involved? Get your local community, sports club, workplace or school/university on board to support the cause and rock those Mo's together!

The world's first service club, the Rotary Club of Chicago, Illinois, USA, was formed on 23 February 1905 by Paul Harris.

Rotary is a worldwide organisation of business and professional leaders that provides humanitarian service, encourages high ethical standards in all vocations, and helps build goodwill and peace in the world. More than 1.2 million Rotarians belong to over 34,100 Clubs in 210

countries and geographical areas. Rotary Club membership represents a cross-section of the community's business and professional men and women. The world's Rotary Clubs meet regularly and are non-political, non-religious, and open to all cultures, races, and creeds.

The Rotary motto is Service Above Self.

OBJECT OF ROTARY

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST. The development of acquaintance as an opportunity

for service;

SECOND. High ethical standards in business and professions,

the recognition of the worthiness of all useful

occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's

occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
