Organ and Tissue Registration and Donation.


We are very fortunate to have Professor O'Connell as our Guest Speaker, an international expert on organ transplant research and on the critical need for organ and tissue donations. More than 1,500 Australians are currently awaiting transplant treatment.

Professor O'Connell is a Professor of Medicine at the University of Sydney, Director of Transplantation at Westmead Hospital and a founding Director of the Centre for Transplant and Renal Research at the Westmead Institute of Medical Research.

Professor O'Connell is a Past President of the international professional body - The Transplantation Society and was a guest speaker at the Rotary International Convention in Seoul in May 2016.


He was a member of the Australian Government Organ Donor Task Force that recommended the establishment of the Australian Organ and Tissue Authority to oversee organ donation in Australia. He is committed to the establishment of ethical solutions to the world wide organ shortage.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO CLUB BY-LAWS TO BE CONSIDERED BY BOARD ON 23 OCTOBER 2018

A review of our by-laws was instigated by President Richard Green with the intention of making the composition and functioning of the Board more flexible, less prescriptive, and allowing the President more freedom in determining the functions of different portfolios.

President Richard, together with Greg Muldoon and Ross Symons discussed a number of changes to achieve the above objectives. The review concentrated on By-laws Part 2 Board of Director and the election of Officers and Directors, Part 5 Club meeting cycle, and Part 8 concerning the Committees.

The proposed changes are to be considered by the Board at its meeting on 23 October 2018.

The main changes proposed are;

- The Board is classified as Mandatory (President, President-Elect, Secretary and Treasurer) and Optional (Directors of Committees) responsible for the 8 Rotary functions and club activities.namely; Membership, Public Relations, Club Administration, Community Service, International Service, Vocational Service, The Rotary Foundation and Youth Service.
- 2. The current President-Elect, prior to the AGM, must nominate how many Committees their term of President will have, and the functions of those Committees selected from the 8 Rotary functions and activities. This will determine the number of Directors to be elected at the AGM.
- 3. President-elect is not automatically the Vice-President
- 4. President to nominate up to 2 Vice-Presidents from all the Directors, to assist with the responsibilities/workload of the President.
- 5. Amend meeting by-laws to reflect current twice monthly meeting cycle.
- 6. Simplify current description of what each of the 8 Rotary functions are responsible for.
- 7. Allows the President to allocate any of the Club Administration responsibilities to another Director.

The Board will consider the proposal and make a decission and recommendation on the proposal. That will need to be considered by the Club as its general meeting on 13th or 27th November 2018, so any amendments are in place for the AGM on the 4 December 2018.

MILESTONE AT 30 JUNE 2018

2017/18 SAW A MAJOR ACHIEVEMENT BY THE CLUB - OUT NET CHARITY ACCOUNT FUND RAISING PASSED THE \$1 MILLION.


