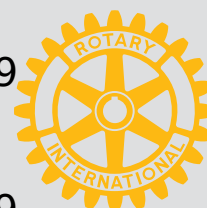

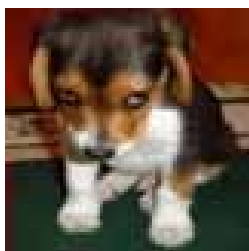
There was a board meeting prior to the meeting on 12 September where the programme and the budget for the year was discussed.

LAST MEETING - 12 SEPTEMBER 2017; GUEST SPEAKER - GLENN SCOTT

At our last meeting we were very fortunate to hear Glenn Scott from Hassell Studio speaking on the very recent transformation of the Darling Harbour convention, exhibition and entertainment facilities.

What an amazing project! What an iconic site set on over 20 hectares in the lee of the western CBD! What a challenge for those involved in its urban planning, design and building!

What an opportunity for Glenn as an architect to be given the brief to lead a team co-ordinating from inception the architectural design and delivery of these three major facilities!

Glenn's enthusiasm for his subject was infectious as he took us through his slides showing the detail of the project. It was very interesting to understand the importance of the urban design for large scale public amenity and for public thoroughfares, and open spaces, to connect the urban streets and lanes of Pyrmont, Broadway and Central with the City. It was fascinating to understand the skill to design each building to become both a magnificent public building in its urban setting and a stunning example of its kind in providing an international standard of public facilities. Mind boggling was the description of the complexities of structural design and building methods to achieve the the architectural designs.

What an incredible achievement for all concerned to complete this huge and highly complex project within 3 years from commencement! Thank you Glenn for sharing your professional experience and insights with us.
