The Australian National Maritime Museum is Australia's national centre for maritime collections, exhibitions, research and archaeology. The museum has one of the largest floating historical vessel collections in the world, featuring the renowned replica of Captain Cook's HMB Endeavour, the former Navy destroyer HMAS Vampire, the former Navy patrol boat HMAS Advance and former Navy submarine HMAS Onslow.

Vanessa Weedon is the Head of Projects at the ANMM where she has worked for the last 4 years and is responsible for delivery of the museum's site renewal Masterplan and major exhibition programme.

Vanessa has Master's degrees in architectural history and building conservation from US and UK universities. She has previously worked for the United Nations Development Program in Vietnam. Prior to that she was a director of Sydney project management consultancy, Incoll.

Vanessa will be telling us about the future of the Australian National Maritime Museum.





The Rotary motto is *Service Above Self.* 

# **OBJECT OF ROTARY**

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

- FIRST. The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;
- SECOND. High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
- THIRD. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;
- FOURTH. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.
