## PRESIDENT AND DIRECTOR'S REPORTS, 2018-2019

### President's Report - Year Ending 30 June 2019



This year has been an interesting year. In spite of the members being involved in other activities and most members going on holidays for extensive periods, the club has been able to achieve quite a lot.

To enable the club to elect a president who might be absent from the club for periods, the bylaws were changed. The bylaws were updated and simplified. The position of Vice President was introduced. A maximum of two Vice Presidents can be nominated by the President or elected by the board.

We had a number of meetings with Chatswood Rotary Club but it was decided for now, that the two clubs would not merge.

We had many good meetings with high quality speakers. There was a slight change of the program chairman but as most of the speakers had been arranged, this had no effect on the meetings. The three sergeants did a good job running the meetings and fine sessions.

Sue Ward arranged an enjoyable Christmas party with past exchange student Carol Viotto present. Two restaurant dinners were also arranged. These were enjoyed by the members and their partners.

We had a debate against Lindfield Rotary Club at one of their meetings, which we narrowly won.

There was a Rotary Foundation meeting with a number of District Foundation officers present to see Neil Howie receive a Paul Harris sapphire pin for his work at the club and district level. We also made a donation to The Foundation.

The club was involved with all aspects of youth, except the youth exchange program. For the first time we sent a student to Canberra for Rotary Experience in Citizenship. This proved to be a great success. We ran an essay and public speaking competitions for the three local primary schools. We presented awards to pupils at 8 schools in the area. We helped at the Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) Forum and conducted mock interviews at Killara High School. As in the past we manned the BBQs for Fathers day at Roseville Public School. This year we were also asked to help on Mother's day.



On the fund raising front we held a fun run and although we did not raise as much we learnt some lessons for the future.

The wine and cheese tasting evening was successful and was a good social function.

We continued to hold Bunnings BBQs which are also a chance for members to mix.

Really to contribute to all the charities / activities we need to raise more funds.

We used our funds for youth activities , The Rotary Foundation , a donation to Carevan, a donation towards a head coil for RNSH , a water tank for Trundle Central school and some other smaller donations.

As a community activity, a small group carried out graffiti removal We participated in Clean up Australia with the assistance of the East Roseville scouts. The scouts also helped with the fun run and we were represented at their 70th anniversary celebrations. Our club again conducted the Tree of Joy.

## **Community, International & Vocational Service Director's Report 2018-2019**

### **COMMUNITY**

The Club supported and participated in number of varied activities again in the 2018-19 Rotary year. Included below are also some donations made to worthwhile causes and charities – although there was no actual physical involvement by RCRC members. However – they do come under the broad category of ‘Community’.

#### **Royal North Shore Hospital MRI Head Coil**

We were asked by the RNSH Fund-raising charity group – the Pink Ladies – to assist in the purchase of an important piece of equipment for the Medical Imaging Department. We approached all the local Rotary Clubs (in total 20 clubs from North Shore, City North, Upper North Shore, Norwest and Riverside) and had positive responses from Chatswood, Lindfield, Crows Nest and Northbridge. Roseville Chase donated \$5,000 and together we raised \$20,000 – including a District Grant from the Rotary Foundation. The Pink Ladies raised the balance of the funds with an amazing \$58,000.

The Rotary clubs' contribution was presented at an RCRC Meeting on 9th October 2018 and representatives of the club's attended an informal morning tea 'thank you' at the RNSH on Monday 27th May. We are also hoping for an item in the North Shore Times.

## **Roseville Public School Mothers' Day Breakfast**

After many years of cooking the Fathers' Day breakfast BBQ at Roseville Public School, this year we were asked by the P&C to help at a Mothers' Day Breakfast on May 3 2019. This was another very successful community event and the team received enthusiastic thanks!

## **Graffiti Removal**

RCRC Graffiti Busters Team continues to operate in the Roseville and Roseville Chase area (plus occasionally some bordering areas eg Lindfield) – removing illegal, vandal graffiti. The main participants are Peter Lewis, Peter Lefmann and Rotary Friend and PP John Hammond. We work with Ku-ring-gai Council and other organisations such as Ausgrid. Each year we join the National Graffiti Removal Day – although this year the date (Sunday 21st October 2018) clashed with other commitments. However, we did report our activity on numerous other days to the GRD organisers.



During the Rotary year July 2018 to June 2019, the Team has removed graffiti from 74 individual sites (many repeat locations) and from vandalised areas totalling approximately 179 square metres. This work has occupied the Team in probably a total of over 24 man-hours this year alone.

We received a contribution of \$2,000 from Ku-ring-gai Council, and via the 'Rotary Graffiti Removal Champion' Roger Norman of Turramurra Rotary, we report quarterly to Ku-ring-gai Municipal Council on our graffiti removal work.

In all the Community events, we thank the numerous Friends of Rotary – partners and family members who have often assisted. With the Graffiti Busters, we again recognise the valuable support of Storage King at Chatswood for the generous complimentary storage of the Club's graffiti-removal trailer (and also some RCRC document archives).

## **INTERNATIONAL**

Our involvement in International projects has been low key this year – and our one contribution has been to join Northbridge Rotary in their East Timor project, where we are donating \$5,000.

## Youth Service Director's Report 2018-2019

This year Youth Service has again had a busy and productive year. Many thanks to the Youth Services Committee, Ian Fraser, Ian Robertson and John Hartley for their efforts and support.

The range of activities that Youth Service has undertaken has again been very varied and was as follows:

**1 – RAIC (Rotary Adventure in Citizenship)** –Mari Watkins, a year 11 student from Roseville College attended RAIC which was held in Canberra on budget week from 30 March to 6 April 2019. Mari attended our Club Youth Night on 9 April and gave a very impressive and illuminating speech about her experiences at RAIC.

**2. – NYSF – (National Youth Science Forum)** - Madeline Carmody of Roseville College attended the 2019 NYSF in Canberra in January 2019. She reported that the Forum was a great success and was very beneficial to her in considering a future career in science. Madeline was unable to attend our Club Youth Night due to school commitments.

**3. - RYLA – (Rotary Youth Leadership Award)** Peter Taylor attended 2019 RYLA in January 2019. Peter came to our Club Youth Night on 9 April and reported how stimulating and rewarding his attendance at RYLA was for him

**4. – RYPEN – (Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment)**

The Summer Camp was held on 1-3 February 2019. 5 Students – Shore-2, Killarney Heights – 2 and Killara High – 1 attended and the reports from the schools were that the students' attendance had been very worthwhile.

**5.- School Awards** – Presentations were made to a total of 8 schools during September- December 2018. The award was generally given to the best all round student in Year 6 at each school.

**6. -MUNA (Model United Nations Assembly)** – 2 teams from SHORE were sponsored by our Club to MUNA 2019, held 15-16 June 2019.

Our SHORE team comprising Finn McCredie, Tom Munns and Olivier Daish-Gorge, representing USA, were judged to be the best of the 80 odd countries



competing, and will now progress to Canberra for the National MUNA Assembly in August.

**7. -Youth Night** was held on 9 April 2019 when we had attendances and presentations by the persons who had attended RAIC and RYLA.

**8. - Schools Public Speaking and Essay Competition** was held on 11 June 2019 when students will attend and compete in public speaking and essay competitions.

Rebecca Frantz (Roseville Public School) was the winner of the written essay competition with her subject "Marie Curie".

Stephanie O'Chee (Roseville Public School) was the winner of the public speaking competition with her topic "Living between Cultures"

**9.- Mock Interviews** – A number of our members attended mock interviews at Killara High on 10 April to assist students in their interview techniques.

**10.- STEM – (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths).** A number of our members attended the STEM Day at Ravenswood College on 28 June 2019 helping to supervise students in STEM competitions.  
This is a very interesting activity to be involved with.

## **The Rotary Foundation Director's Report 2018- 2019 Director; PP Neil Howie**

### **FOUNDATION GRANTS**

#### **District Grant- RNS Hospital MRI Head Coil project**

- District Foundation approved our District Grant of \$3,000 to help the RNSH Pink Ladies raise \$70,000 for a new Head Coil for the MRI in the Imaging Department.
- Total funds of \$15,000 donated by Roseville Chase RC (\$4,900), The Rotary Foundation (\$3,000), Chatswood RC (\$3,000), Crows Nest RC (\$3,000), and Lindfield RC (\$1,100) were presented to RNS Hospital at our Club meeting on 9 October 2018. A further amount of \$5,000 was later donated by Northbridge RC directly to the RNSH Pink Ladies who funded the balance of the monies for the project.
- The grant from the Foundation was paid in two instalments with the final amount received by the Club in late May shortly after the Head Coil became operational at the hospital.
- Representatives from our Club, The Foundation and the other Rotary Clubs attended a morning tea at the hospital on 27 May to see the new Head Coil and the MRI unit in the Imaging Department.

#### **Foundation Global Grant - East Timor - Water and Sanitation project**

- In June 2018 our Club agreed to contribute A\$5,000 and to join with Northbridge RC in a Global Grant application for US\$25,000 to build a gravity water supply and sanitation facilities for a Junior High School, homes and the market place at Ermera in Timor Leste for a project cost of US\$35,000.
- Barry Anderson and other Northbridge Rotarians visited the site in October with Barry speaking to our Club about this project and other projects in East Timor at our meeting on 13 November. 2018.
- Approval of the Global Grant application and commencement of construction is anticipated in the next few months.

#### **Foundation Evening**

- At a joint Club Foundation evening on 14 May 2018, with Chatswood RC, our guests were PDG David Rands, the District Foundation Chair and the District Scholarships Chair, PDG Pam Pritchard from Turrumurra RC, who introduced our speaker, William Chan.



- William, an Architect as our District Global Grant Scholar, in 2015-2016 at the Politecnico in Milan studied innovative architectural and engineering strategies for water and sanitation design in impoverished communities.
- The Club thanked PDG David Rands for his tireless efforts as District Chairman in carrying out the important work of the Foundation and for his outstanding leadership of the District Foundation team over the last 3 years.

## **FOUNDATION GIVING**

### **Annual Programs Fund**

This year the Club has paid A\$ 4,000 as its annual contribution to the Annual Programs Fund.

In addition, it is anticipated that our members will personally contribute to the Annual Fund as Centurion members

### **End Polio Now**

This year the Club has paid A\$2,000 as its annual contribution to the End Polio Now campaign.

### **Recognition of Paul Harris Fellows**

- At the Changeover Dinner on 10 July 2018, our immediate PDG Susan Wakefield presented Peter McKeown, John Hartley and Peter Lefmann with their second Sapphire Pins and Grant Campbell with his first Sapphire pin.
- At a later meeting in July President Richard presented Michael Harrowell with his certificate of recognition and badge as a Paul Harris Fellow.

## **Fund Raising Chairman's Report 2018-2019**

### **Introduction**

One of the most important activities in our Rotary year is the planning and carrying out of fundraising necessary for our many charitable and service projects.

In the 2018-2019 year our fundraising relied primarily on:-

- partnering with a community group, the RNS Hospital Ladies Committee ("the Pink Ladies") five other Rotary Clubs and the Rotary Foundation to fund the new MRI head coil for the Hospital's Imaging Department;
- conducting frequent Bunnings BBQ's throughout the year at Chatswood and Belrose;
- holding our annual Fun Run from Castle Cove oval and through the streets of Castle Cove; and
- holding a Wine and Cheese Tasting Evening at Roseville Public School in partnership with Wine Selectors.

### **RNS Hospital MRI Head Coil project**

A total of \$20,000 was contributed for this significant project by Rotary through Roseville Chase RC (\$4,900), instigating the fundraising and working in partnership with Northbridge RC (\$5,000), The Rotary Foundation (\$3,000), Chatswood RC (\$3,000), Crows Nest RC (\$3,000), and Lindfield RC (\$1,100).

The RNSH Pink Ladies contributed the balance of \$50,000 from their hospital fundraising activities for the project cost of \$70,000.

### **Bunnings BBQ's**

The Club conducted 9 BBQ's at Chatswood and Belrose for a net fundraising of \$9,601.

The BBQ's are not only are a major fundraising activity but they also provide a good opportunity for members, partners and friends of the Club to make a very positive contribution to Club activities and to enjoy catching up as they work. Special thanks to John Hartley for his invaluable efforts working with his van and



managing the set up/pack up/clean up each day and to Partytime Hire for their support over the many years that our Club has been doing the BBQ's.

Many thanks also to Grant and Pam Campbell for co-ordinating the rosters and to Peter Lefmann for managing the bookings with Bunnings.

### **Fun Run**

This year the Fun Run was held on Sunday 29 July 2018 and raised income of \$2,643. A particular difficulty arose for participation numbers when a major Sydney run was rescheduled unexpectedly to the same day leading to a drop off in our runners.

Our very special thanks to Mike Harrowell who has been the driving force behind the event and continues each year to seamlessly manage this significant project. The next event on Sunday 29 July 2019 will be a primary fund raiser for the Club and a big effort is required.

### **Wine and Cheese Tasting Evening**

This year we held a new event in conducting a Wine and Cheese Tasting Evening in partnership with Wine Selectors on Saturday 6 April 2019 at the Roseville Public School Hall. Ninety-one people attended to enjoy a very successful evening with Wine Selectors providing a fine variety of excellent wines for tasting with cheeses and accompaniments provided by our Club.

Ticket monies and our sales commissions were supplemented by a raffle of a long weekend use of a Mercedes Benz (donated by Mercedes Benz North Shore) and cartons of wine (donated by Wine Selectors) and by subsequent sales of leftover wine.

Special thanks to David Kelly and his team from Wine Selectors, Roseville Public School for use of their hall, Mercedes Benz North Shore, and Partytime Hire for donating equipment.

Our net profit from the evening for fundraising was \$4,063.
