LAST MEETING 24 APRIL - PHF PP Richard Wilmott

It was very fitting and appropriate that Richard Wilmott, a Charter Member of our Club, should be the guest speaker on the 24 April 2018 - the 28th anniversary of our Club's charter.

It was equally relevant that Richard should relay some very detailed, personal information about his antecedent family members' association with World War 1 and II, at our ANZAC Commemorative Dinner.

From the landings at Gallipoli by Charles Aitkens (Richards fathers cousin), and the very personal, detailed, articulate and descriptive letters he wrote to his mother during the war (some extracts of which Richard read to our meeting), to the details of his Grand Father's (Allan Crouch) involvement and injury at the Battle of Fromelles and his repatriation, we gained first hand information and understanding of just what it was really like for those people so deeply engaged in battle, and so far from "home".

The story Richard related about his Aunty, Bessie Wilmott, who was one of the 22 nurses massacred on Bangka Island in the Dutch East Indies, and the later detailed story told by the one surviving nurse, Vivian Bullwinkle, was a very touching moment for not only us, but also for Richard.

Thank you Richard for the indepth incite into your extended families war time experiences, and the personal information you shared with us.

OXFORD FALLS PEACE PARK

For many years now Ro and I, often with family members, have been attending

the day break ANZAC Service at the Oxford Falls Peace Park. The event is organised by the Beacon Hill Rural Fire Brigade.It commences at 6.00 am.

The Oxford Falls Public School first opened in the small Church of England at Oxford Falls in 1928 with eight enrolments. The present building on the Peace Park site was

built in 1930. With the school's closure in 1986, the schoolhouse was threatened with demolition but with the assistance of a local campaign and the support of Warringah Council, including the late local D Riding councillor Paul Couvret, the peace park was created and the school now serves as a community hall and is the site of the annual ANZAC day Dawn service. On Anzac Day, the dawn service attracts locals from far and wide to the Parks rustic setting.






