

The Rotary Foundation and Funding AGM Report 5 December 2017

Fundraising

Committee

Neil Howie, Mike Harrowell (Fun Run), Greg Bell and Sue Ward.

For 2017-2018 we will be relying primarily on Bunnings BBQ's, the Fun Run and another Comedy for a Cause evening in March. More ideas are needed!

We need a major effort from all members to actively participate in fundraising.

Bunnings BBQ's

We expect to do about 12 BBQ gigs during the year. Last year we did 11 raising \$15742 or an average of \$1431 ea. So far this year 3 BBQ's have raised \$4225. We are budgeting income of \$17,000 for this year.

Fun Run

This year the Fun Run held on 30 July had a net income of \$4830 down from \$6828 in 2016. We are budgeting \$7,000 for next year's event in late July 2018.

Comedy for a Cause

At a recent meeting members were reticent about having another one but this worked well the last time. It was a great night with 200 attending. Not a huge fundraiser but it was primarily held to promote the Club.

Broadly:-

□ tickets sell for \$35 with \$12 to CC and \$23 to Club. Minimum fee of \$1200 to CC.

- □ □ a light servery meal at low cost
- □ □ We need to get guests but CC will will send out emails and handle ticketing and marketing. They have the guest list from last time.
- $\Box \Box CC$ will set up room with chairs and lighting etc.
- On present info. If we can get 120 a reasonable estimate of income is in the order of \$3,500 to \$4,000.

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Other events

So far only one other event has been planned being the Murder on the Orient Express Movie Night as both a social event and a fundraiser for End Polio Now. The evening raised about \$500 from movie sales.

Other events are needed to raise \$2500 for smaller activities.

Budget

A very rough preliminary fundraising budget is:-

BBQ's\$17,000Fun Run\$7,000Comedy Cause\$3,500Other\$2,500Total\$30,000

The Rotary Foundation

Committee

The Committee this year is Neil Howie and Ian Garrard.

Foundation Grants

District Foundation has allocated its District Designated Funds (DDF) for this year. Our Club has not made an application for a District Grant for this Rotary year as it does not currently have an International project (maximum grant of \$6,000) or a local community project (maximum grant of \$3,000).

There may be some DDF available for an application by the Club later in the year if any Club does not take up an allocated grant due to failure of the project.

An important goal for the Club for the year is to identify an international or a local project possibly in partnership with one or more other clubs to take up opportunities for Foundation funding next year or in later years, particularly, for a large project.

Foundation Giving

Current estimations of Club fund raising indicate that the Club should be able to fund the same level of contributions as last year to both the Annual Programs Fund (which is the source of DDF for funding of District Grants) and to End Polio Now



The Club will be making the following contributions:-Annual Programs Fund -\$A 4,000End Polio Now -\$A 3,500

The Club's contributions should be reviewed in February 2018 to have regard to the likely fundraising for 2017-2018 and the importance of the Rotary Foundation as the Rotary Charity.

Members will be asked to participate in the Centurion program to personally donate \$A 100 to the Annual Programs Fund. Last year about \$A 1300 was contributed.

Recognition of Paul Harris Fellows

At the Changeover Dinner on 4 July 2017, our District Governor Peter Ward presented David Brand and Pam Campbell with certificates of recognition as Paul Harris Fellows and Peter McKeown with a Sapphire Pin. At a later meeting President Peter presented Ted Anderson and Peter Leffmann with Sapphire Pins.

The Club should continue during the year to recognise members and outstanding people in the community as Paul Harris Fellows and by subsequent recognition with Sapphire Pins. The Club has substantial credits with the Foundation to meet the cost of \$1,000 for each recognition.
