

Reaching the Goal of Polio Eradication Club Challenge

END POLIO NOW

The progress in eradication of polio has been spectacular with only 37 cases worldwide in 2016 in 3 countries- Afghanistan, Pakistan and Nigeria. A dramatic decrease from 1985 when there were an estimated 350,000 cases in 125 countries!

The last cases of polio may occur this year. It is crucial that Clubs remain committed to achieving the end of polio with financial support. Roseville Chase has been a substantial contributor to Polio Plus for many years.

District 9685 in February initiated funding from District Designated Funds (which are generally used for Global and District grants for club projects) to encourage Clubs to generously donate to the Polio Plus Fund. The combination of Club funds and DDF has the major benefit of triggering considerable matching funds from the Rotary World Fund and from the Bill Gates Foundation.

In this Centenary year of the Rotary Foundation, District Foundation has challenged each Club to raise US\$ 2,650 (in recognition of Arch Klump's starting donation of US\$26.50) by 31 March 2017.

The target amount for each Club of US\$2,650 with current exchange rate is A\$3,578. Our Club has already budgeted this year (subject to fundraising) to donate A\$3,000 to the Polio Plus Fund and A\$4,000 to the Annual Programs Fund.

Following the Board meeting on 14 March, Roseville Chase has accepted the challenge and has donated A\$3,578 to the Polio Plus Fund to achieve the the deadline date of 31 March for matching funds.

E-clubs

Rotary e-clubs are a lot like other Rotary clubs: they meet weekly, carry out service projects, support The Rotary Foundation, and socialize with each other. So what's different about e-clubs? You join your meeting online when it's convenient for you, day or night, any day of the week.



How does an e-club operate?

E-club members use webinars, videoconferencing, message boards, instant messaging, or tools like Skype and Google Hangout to communicate. For example, a club member might post content online for that week's meeting, then other members join the discussion throughout the week. Some e-club members also meet in person at service projects, social activities or the RI Convention.

Any Rotarian can make up a missed meeting by participating in an e-club online meeting.

Who can join an e-club?

Members can be from anywhere in the world. Some e-clubs focus their membership in a particular region or community.

An e-club could be right for you if you:

- Have a busy schedule and need a flexible meeting time
- Live in different places throughout the year
- Travel frequently
- Have limited mobility
- Live in an area without a nearby Rotary club

E-Clubs Need

- A dedicated website
- Founding members who are able to manage the club's website
- An online meeting platform to host meetings
- Private sections of the website that only members can access to protect members' online personal data
- Online financial transaction systems that allow members to pay dues, make donations, or process payments

BowelCare General Information Cancer of the Bowel

Australia has the world's highest incidence of bowel cancer – 1 in 12, both men and women, will be diagnosed with bowel cancer by the age 85. Age is an important factor. The risk begins at age 40, doubling every 5 years and more rapidly as the person gets older.

Statistics show 90% of bowel cancers can be successfully cured if detected at an early stage. Early detection leads to an improved prognosis and less severe treatment.

BOWEL CANCERS begin as polyps. Polyps are growths occurring in the lining of the bowel. Not all polyps are cancerous; they may or may not bleed and cause diarrhoea and pain. Because polyps can develop into cancer, early diagnosis and removal of all polyps is important. More than 75% of people who develop bowel cancer do not have a family history of the disease.

Annual Testing: It is recommended that ALL men and women over the age of 40 have a BowelCare test EVERY YEAR.

High Risk

The risk of bowel cancer increases 3 to 4 times the average if:

- One or more of your blood relatives (parent, sibling or child) have had bowel cancer or polyps.
- You've previously had bowel cancer or polyps.
- You've had extensive inflammatory bowel disease (Crohn's or ulcerative colitis).
- You have a history of bleeding with or in the stool.
- You have experienced a recent change in bowel habit or pain in the lower abdomen.

Persons in any of the above categories should consult their doctor for follow up investigation.

Note: Many bowel cancers also occur in people without high risk factors. Rotary and its members are not engaged in the provision of medical advice or medical service to the public but we do encourage people with a bowel disorder to consult their doctor.



- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?
