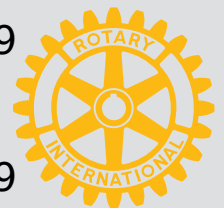

LAST MEETING - 10 March 2020

Jim Wells gave us an interesting insight into the life of Nevil Shute.

Nevil Shute Norway (17 January 1899 – 12 January 1960) was an English novelist and aeronautical engineer who spent his later years in Australia. He used his full name in his engineering career and Nevil Shute as his pen name to protect his engineering career from inferences by his employers (Vickers) or fellow engineers that he was not a serious person or from potential negative publicity in connection with his novels, which included ***On the Beach*** and ***A Town Like Alice***.

In 1948, Shute flew his own aeroplane to Australia and back, accompanied by the writer James Riddell, who published a book, ***Flight of Fancy***, based on the trip, in 1950.

On his return, concerned about what he saw as the decline of his home country, he decided that he and his family would emigrate to Australia. In 1950.

In the 1950s and 1960s he was one of the world's best-selling novelists.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CERTIFICATES

The Office of the Children's Guardian is an independent statutory authority in NSW Government. It protects children in NSW by promoting and regulating quality, child safe organisations and services.

Many members who previously applied for clearance for Working with Children, will have received or will be shortly receiving, email notice that their clearance is about to expire, and setting out the process for applying for renewal of the clearance.

The application can be made online, and the email sets out the procedure to be followed in the online process, and the subsequent need to attend at a NSW Services Centre with appropriate identification documents to complete the renewal application. There is no fee for "volunteers" which covers Rotary.

Peter Lefmann is the confidential "keeper" of the information for our Club. When you receive notification that your application has been cleared and your certificate renewed, please forward a copy of that advice to Peter Lefmann.

Remote Meeting Options

For those clubs who choose to suspend meetings for a time, there are some other alternates that may assist with ongoing communications and collaboration, and to overcome any sense of isolation. I include below some options courtesy of one of my national classmates south of the border:

Seize the opportunity to innovate and improve in other areas.

1. Now is a great time to enhance your electronic communications such as club bulletins, websites and social media such as Facebook.
2. Connect into the social media pages other community groups and organisations in your community. This is a great way to stay connected and even broaden your reach.
3. Connect with your communities by helping our less fortunate neighbours cope with the effects of isolation and fear, or by supporting our health authorities to address this situation.
4. Assist health authorities communicate best practices or provide needed equipment or support into your communities.
5. Many people are familiar with Video Conferencing programs with the District and e-Club using Zoom program successfully on a regular basis for many. It is not as difficult as many may think, and works with both phones and with PCs of any sort.

The Rotary e-Club of Greater Sydney would like to offer any assistance it can to help Rotary clubs and committees to continue to meet as per normal - but online rather than physically.

Zoom Video Conferencing - account sign-up

I am urging clubs to consider implementing use of video conferencing programs. There is an opportunity for cluster clubs to collaborate on a subscription to reduce the cost and share the access. Scheduling of meetings can then be managed to ensure there are no clashes.

The E-Club would be happy to help Clubs and/or Clusters use Zoom as a meeting platform. The E-Club has a subscription, as does District 9685, or you can sign-up for a Zoom account; plans and pricing can be found here - <https://zoom.us/pricing>.

- There is a free account option with restricted function, ie only 40min duration.
- There is also a Pro Account (\$20.99/month), as used by the District Team.

This year's BowelCare kit will cost **\$20.00**. This price rise is due to an increase from the supplier. The price includes pathology testing, with notification of your result to both yourself and your nominated doctor. Your result will be issued within 30 days of your test kit being received by pathology. Please use the pre-paid envelope provided within the kit.

Also available is a Mail Order form for your convenience. The price of a BowelCare kit by mail will be **\$25.00** inclusive of all postage and fees. If you choose to take up this option, complete, sign and return the Mail Order form. .printed on the back of this letter using the instructions provided.

BowelCare Australia is a division of CancerCare Australia Limited ABN 35 154 219 057 (CAL). CAL is a Health Promotion Charity and Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) endorsed from 11th November 2011 by the Australian Taxation Office and is registered as a charity with the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profit Commission (ACNC). Donations to CAL of Two Dollars or more are tax deductible for the donor. - FOURTH. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

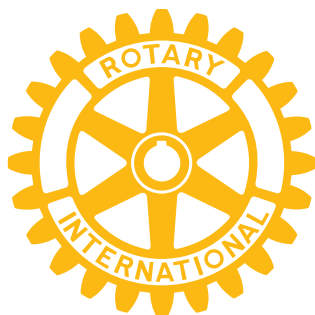
