







#### Speakers from March

#### AN ELECTION MUST BE APPROACHING

Our guest speaker at our first meeting of the month was Adam Crouch, Member for Terrigal and an Honorary Member of our club. There can be little doubt that Adam must be one of the most enthusiastic members of our State Parliament. Again he demonstrated to us the sheer pleasure that he derives from representing the individual members of his electorate. Tellingly, he refers to himself as a "Parliamentarian" rather than as a "Politician".

Adam shared with us some of the achievements that had given him the most satisfaction such as the new Palliative Care Unit in Gosford Hospital and a similar unit to be opened in the Wyong Hospital, as well as the Boardwalk at Terrigal. During question time he commented on the frustration that sometimes comes when the naysayers try to claim credit for projects which they had previously opposed. This demonstrated for us how necessary it is to be able to focus one what one can get done and try to ignore the often ill informed criticisms . Adam's enthusiasm is infectious and it is hard to avoid the feeling, that if all our elected representatives approached their jobs with the same attitude, then our Parliaments may be more effective institutions.


#### A STORY OF HOPE

Such was our privilege when we were addressed by Lorraine Churchill, a retired nurse and now the secretary

of Kids in Need a not for profit charity. This charity assists families on the Coast with finance when illness or disability is inflicting pain and expense.In the past 18 years the Charity has distributed \$4.4 million to 3642 families to cover such things as accommodation, travel,
