## Speakers from April

### BRAIN SCIENCE

Our guest speakers Dr Derek Sankey and Dr Minkang Kim gave us a talk on their research into brain science as it relates to the development of literacy and numeracy skills in children. Their thrust was that school teachers are not taught about brain science in their degree courses and that without such knowledge their effectiveness is diminished. Dr Kim demonstrated for us how the different parts of the brain process information particularly at the infant learning stage. Dr Sankey was critical of the Universities for in his opinion deliberately failing to include brain science in their teaching courses. As we have in our club a number of very experienced retired teachers, who have seen and dealt with all manner of classroom situations, question time proved to be most illuminating. Our guests did concede that their views did have a degree of controversy. Nonetheless they were very passionate and enthusiastic about their subject which helped to contribute to a most stimulating evening.

Dale Massie was born and educated in Sydney and has been a high school teacher at Terrigal High School for almost 11 years, teaching Business Studies, Legal Studies and Economics. Prior to this, she was a Partner in a Commercial Property firm in Mayfair, London for approximately 20 years. She returned to Australia to rear her two children and to remain.

She is also one of seven volunteer Board members of ChEd Nepal, an Australian registered charity that supports underprivileged children's education in Nepal.

Her husband, Mike Faulkner was also a volunteer Board member of ChEd Nepal. Mike was diagnosed with lung cancer having never smoked, and sadly died in August 2022.

Lung cancer kills more Australians than any other cancer. Dale has promised Mike to help raise awareness and funds to help curb and ultimately cure, this prolific disease and to lobby government to improve funding. She has arranged a cancer research fund-raising ball which will be held, in Mike's honour, at The Crown Plaza in Terrigal, on Saturday, 26<sup>th</sup> August.

**Jodi Rodgers** is a qualified sexologist, counsellor and special education teacher.

Jodi has worked within the education and community sectors in both Australia and internationally and has extensive experience working with people with disability and diverse neurology across the life span.

Birds and Bees specialises in delivering counselling services and workshops for people with a disability with a focus on sexuality, sexual health and relationships, as well as delivering training for parents, carers and professionals to raise the community's capacity in this sometimes-tricky area.
