

Anyone who had anything to do with RAWCS Eastern Region during that period would know Jack Elliott. Jack's involvement with Rotary and RAWCS is huge. Many of us have been touched by Jack's compassion and many of our projects have benefited from Jack's wisdom and advice.

Jack was well known and a much loved Rotarian. Jack always went that extra mile to do good in the world. Jack devoted his time selflessly to Rotary aims and is a perfect example of a Rotarian who puts 'Service Above Self'.

During his time in Rotary Jack engaged in several Rotary programs, various committees and projects including:

Jack served on at least two committees to allow them to become RAWCS projects with a result that some of those in these organisations have eventually become Rotarians.



We are focused on how to continue building more awareness of the benefits clubs receive from using the RAWCS infrastructure.

Currently, only 25 per cent of Rotary Clubs in Australia have projects registered with RAWCS, and club donations are generally only to one project. This shows there is the opportunity for significant growth. Australia's reduction in Rotary membership, as well as the ageing of our members, is a trend we are deeply concerned about.

RAWCS will be taking proactive steps to help address this issue by developing further offerings and promotion targeted at establishing and expanding relationships with both corporates and philanthropic associations. More information on this and other marketing activities will be publicised as they become available.

We have also coped with the introduction of the Australian Charities and Not-For-Profits Commission and thankfully received a clean bill of health in a recent review. It was hard work — but we did it. As National Chairman, I am incredibly proud of the entire RAWCS team for their efforts.

How to check and maintain your RAWCS Project

Project Managers & Deputy Project Managers,

Each of you have access to the RAWCS Directory to view or maintain your projects by entering this website:

https://directory.rawcs.com.au/Login.aspx

Enter your email address as requested and your password. If you have forgotten your password or have not been given one, request a forgotten password from this page and an email will be sent to you with a password to allow you to enter the website. If this does not work your email address may be incorrect and you will need to contact me or Michael Willis for us to correct the email address on the website.



On entering the website your name will be displayed top right and by clicking the arrow you can change your password or log out. To see projects that you are Manager or Deputy of click on search and they will all display. Click on the pencil to view the background detail and upload photos. Click on the book page to view what is seen on the public website.

The RAWCS Website Committee would like to invite you to view your project from the RAWCS Directory where you can see all details we have entered about your project. This is a valuable tool for you to:

- Check that the name and description continue to describe what your project is currently doing
- Check that the Project Manager, Deputy and Committee names and details are correct
- Check that the sponsoring Rotary Club and District are correct
- View all transactions made to or from your account
- View all documents and reports both for the project and from your volunteer teams.

UPLOAD photographs that market your project and are displayed on the public website **PHOTOGRAPHS**

We would like you to select a photograph or a series of photographs to upload that will market your project to donors. These should be in JPEG or PNG files formats and of no more than 2MB.



APPEAL or CROWD FUNDING

If you wish you can contact us to assist in develop a specific appeal and targeted amount for your project that will show a barometer on the website with the target achieved on the website. You can nominate donation values for specific items that you require for the donor to click on when making their donation. This facility also generates Iframes that can be copied and pasted to your own website that will link the donors directly to your RAWCS donation page.
