

# Jackie Pearson – Last Week's Speaker

Jackie was introduced by Fiona.

Jackie has worked as a journalist, editor, managing editor and consultant since 1987. In the past she was deputy editor of Choice Magazine and then, when they went digital, became executive producer of their money and rights content online. She currently provides journalist input for the Peninsular News.

The theme for her presentation to the club was - the importance of independent journalism and its interrelationship with the community and service organisations such as Rotary.

Jackie said that she moved to the Central Coast in 2001 and raised her three children here and has been working for Central Coast Newspapers since April 2015 and she loves it.

In earlier times, 1984, Jackie worked with typewriters and compositors who assembled the lead letters onto trays. She considers herself lucky to be still employed in this profession as many competent journalists have been superseded by technology.

She said that truth in publishing has taken a knock over the past two decades – e.g. "Fake News". The internet has been a revolution, but it challenges the filter between the writer and the reader. Sometimes we are not sure of the competence of the writer, or whether what is written is the truth.

Jackie asked the following questions: "How do we bring back our ownership of the truth in the public interest? How do we get fairness, equity and truth? How do we get and grow and protect good journalism?" The answer she has found is to embrace community journalism that is not answering to a large corporate publishing house.

Jackie concluded by saying that she is dedicated to building strong communities based on an attitude of openness and caring. She wants to serve Rotary by helping us to tell our stories, ethically and professionally, and thereby advance the causes we are following.

After a series of questions from the members, President Russell thanked Jackie for a most interesting and thoughtful presentation.

## **Our New Members**

Maria Ramos is a past Rotarian who comes from the Rotary Club of Urdaneta where she was President in 2012-13. As President she received an award, in the individual award category, for achieving the highest membership growth while taking on a number of projects such as implementing a solar bulb made from plastic water bottles.
