Funds raised through the Belfast Rotary Club's annual Charity Fundraiser and Golf Tournament support a variety of worthy causes, including 335 student scholarships totaling \$1,270,500.

BELFAST ROTARY SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE ON ITS WAY TO ... \$2,000,000

The Belfast Rotary Club scholarship program commenced in 1982 with a meager budget of \$2,000. In 2022, the program hit a milestone, having awarded over \$1,000,000 in scholarships to 294 deserving students. As of 2024, the Club has awarded \$1,170,500. While it took the Club 41 years to reach the one million dollar mark, we will hit the two million dollar mark in just 11 more years. The scholarships are awarded to students who demonstrate outstanding leadership and service to the community. Students are nominated by their high schools, then submit a written application and are interviewed by a committee of Rotarians. The winning students come from Belfast Area High School, Searsport District High School, Mount View High School and the Waldo County Technical Center.

CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

The Belfast Rotary Club is celebrating its 100th anniversary in 2025. Each committee of the club was challenged to find a way to appropriately celebrate this milestone. The scholarship committee has decided that in 2025 the amount of scholarships to be awarded will be increased from the present amount of \$80,000 to \$100,000, symbolic of our 100th anniversary. The extra \$20,000 will fund two special scholarships, honoring the top students in the categories of leadership and service. Those winners will be appointed our "Centennial Scholars."



Rotary Volunteers are Keeping BELFAST MAINE BEAUTIFUL

THE KEEPING BELFAST MAINE BEAUTIFUL project is an important piece of the Belfast Rotary Club's commitment to community involvement. In 2017, the project was organized by community volunteers, in cooperation with the City of Belfast, for a spring time clean up of roads, beaches, the river, trails and our parks.

For the past eight years, The Rotary Club has provided a team to assist other organizations, schools, and businesses in the cleanup of the 59 miles of roadway in the City. The Club was one of 53 teams who collected 4 tons of roadside waste in 2024. Additionally, 30,000 cigarette butts, or 37.94 pounds, were collected and not going into the bay or the groundwater. Since the project's inception, 25 tons of trash has been collected and properly disposed of!

Reduce. Reuse. Recycle. Refresh your community. This is just one area that the Belfast Rotary Club has been able to assist in making Belfast the great community that it is in which to live and work One of the goals of KBMB is to inspire other communities to hold their own spring cleanups—because when we all pitch in, we can make a real difference.





Food insecurity is an ongoing crisis in Maine. 16% of children in Waldo County live in poverty. 35% of Waldo County residents did not have enough money to adequately feed themselves in 2024. To help alleviate the crisis, the Club began donating to Waldo County food cupboards in 1998.

This year we are donating \$9,000 to local Food Pantries.

Food insecurity costs the state of Maine over \$1 billion every year in lost productivity, adverse health impacts, and increased need for special education services (Maine's Roadmap to End Hunger by 2030). We do not believe that anyone should have to choose between food, medication, and housing. Children who are well nourished do better in school and thereafter in life. We believe that all persons have a right to culturally appropriate foods and to be free from food insecurity. We thank the many people of Waldo County and beyond who have made these donations possible through support of our fundraising efforts including pancake breakfasts, Harbor Fest and through individual donations. 

Every year, teams of **Rotary Santas and Elves** deliver gifts the weekend before Christmas to **children** in towns throughout the county. Now in its 43rd year, the Belfast Rotary Club 100 Fund has helped provide Christmas to thousands of the neediest children in Waldo County. The club set a record in 2024 by serving 215 children—the highest number of children Belfast Rotary has ever served at Christmastime. An award-winning project, the 100 Fund provides each child with a generous gift certificate to Reny's Department Store for new winter clothing and "Santa" toys, as well as a voucher from Colburn's Shoe Store in Belfast entitling them to a new pair of boots. Without the 100 Fund, many disadvantaged children in the county would not have winter coats, boots and gifts at holiday time.

The 100 Fund is fully funded by Belfast Rotary Club member donations and contributions from community members and local businesses. The outpouring of financial contributions for the 2024 Christmas project was amazing, setting records for both the number of donations received and the amount of those donations. This increase in charitable giving allowed the 100 Fund to reach more children than ever before, and Belfast Rotary is grateful to every donor.

The names of the children chosen to receive gifts are provided by Waldo Community Action Partners with input from area teachers, school nurses, social workers, town clerks, churches, Belfast Public Health and Waldo County Head Start. Save the Date! The 18th annual Harbor Fest is coming AUGUST 15-17, 2025!

Belfast Harbor Fest, a community project of the Belfast Rotary Club, honors the maritime tradition of Belfast, Maine, provides people of all ages with opportunities to experience Belfast harbor, stimulates the economic life of Belfast and the Belfast area, fosters membership in the Belfast Rotary Club, and generates support for Rotary service projects that make real Rotary's belief in "Service above Self."

Harbor Fest occurs on the third weekend of August 15. 16 & 17, opens on Friday night with the Evening by the Bay Gala, and closes with The Front Street Shipyard Cardboard Boat Race on Sunday. This year's Harbor Fest Artist is Marsha Donahue of North Light Gallery (artnorthlight.com).

Friday

The Harbor Fest fun ignites Friday night with the joyous Evening by the Bay (EBTB)! Indulge in delicious food and drink, groove to the live band, and get ready to bid high in our exciting live and silent auctions – all while making a real difference. The proceeds from EBTB directly empower local children, with over \$45,000 raised in the past three years for initiatives like the Waldo County Tech School and a new playground at City Park. Join the Belfast Rotary in their 100th anniversary year, 2025, and help them build their legacy by supporting the complete redo of the City Park playground!

Saturday

On Saturday from 7am-4pm, the Belfast Rotary Club partners with local organizations to celebrate Belfast's working harbor and promote outdoor fun and adventures for families. The day starts with a Blueberry Pancake Breakfast and a 5K Road Race, the Bug Run, in which the winner receives 10 lbs. of "Bugs" or lobsters.

At 10am, activities, exhibits and booths open on Steamboat Landing. From 10am-2pm in the children's area, numerous hands-on children's activities give youngsters a taste of building a model boat, how to make a pirate's cutlass, and racing model sail boats, will be scheduled from 10am-2pm. Master craftsmen will be building two boats. Clint Chase, of Chase Small Craft (chase-small-craft.com) will be starting the build of a Frosty pram kit he donated to the Evening By the Bay Auction. It will be a great opportunity to learn from an experienced designer how small boats can be built easily. John Carrick, a master woodworker and Belfast Rotary member, will be showcasing the build of a Passy 12, a small rowboat design used in national competitions. In a new attraction, three teams will build cardboard boats for a special race on Sunday. (If you are interested, let Russell Werkman know at info@belfastharborfest.com.)

In the middle of the day, cheer on the 100+ competitors in the 22nd Annual Come Boating Regatta. From noon to 4pm, learn about the maritime history of Belfast and small boat adventures in a series of seminars by experts from the Penobscot Marine Museum, Belfast Historical Society, Rowing to Wild, and Dory Woman Rowing.

Live bands play throughout the day, providing a festive atmosphere in which to enjoy a day on the harbor and enjoy food, drinks, arts, and other nautically centered wares from a host of vendors.

Sunday

Sunday Morning, Harbor Fest comes to a crescendo with the Front Street Shipyard Cardboard Boat Races. Teams from throughout the mid coast compete to see who can create the most beautiful boat out of cardboard that floats! Prizes include Fastest, Most Creative, and Best Sinking. Registration at 10am, first race at 11am. Arrive early for best viewing spots. Af-

ter the races, savor a lobster lunch while benefiting the local Habitat for Humanity chapter.
