However, Brooke Patterson took it on board and has now informed us that the council has made a commitment to upgrade the park with a projected budget of \$5 million dollars! It is also a demonstration of the fact that as a Rotarian one can effect change far greater than one could do as an individual.

Brooke is undoubtedly going to reinvigorate the standing of Southport, what's more she has promised that the park project will reflect Rotary's input and commitment to the community. We hope we see her regularly going forward.

Scribes Report for Meeting of the 17th November 2020

Chair: Tony P. In the absence of a Sergeant, Tony called the meeting to Order at 6.15 and invited all to recite the 4-Way Test followed by a Toast to the Queen and the people of Australia.

President Andrew welcomed all, particularly Cr Brooke Patterson, Honorary Member Jenny Hobart and partners. Advised that our next and last Meeting for the year will be our Xmas break up at their place on the 1st December. All to contribute to the catering after contacting Vivienne to coordinate. After this our next Meeting will take the form of a Club Assembly and AGM on the 19th January 2021.

Chair Tony P introduce Merv P to give a Rotary Minute

Merv P recounted moving with his family to the Gold Coast from Melbourne in 1986 and setting up an Office Supplies Business in Scarborough Street Southport, he needed an accountant and was introduced to fondly remembered Don Dineen who invited him to Rotary becoming a member May 1987. Merv recounted many fundraising events, Garage Sale, Strawberry Icecream sales at the GC Show and most recently the Carousel that raised approx.. \$100,000 each year, the obvious lasting legacy from which is the Ashmore Men's Shed.

Chair Tony P invited reports from Directors and Members

Secretary Tony G advised of email from David Lee from Stanthorpe who is compiling a book on the "100 Years of Rotary" in our District and requested contributions. Tony has supplied a History of "Bridging the Gap" a District Initiative but largely run by Ron Power as Manager and other members of our Club including PDG Keith Robson and introducing Lea Rickwood to Rotary and our Club. Also a poem commemorating our part in DG Michael's "Raising the Spirits" Outback Links trip to Charleville. Tony P suggested including an article on 64yrs of assisting Indonesian children's education, begun by Cyril and recently single handedly by himself

Lionel reported recent storm damage to the "Meals on Wheels" building to a total of \$19,000.

Peter O advised that the AGM of the Men's Shed that now has 80 members is scheduled for the following day.

Michael I reported that our District 9640 has had a nett increase in Rotary Membership of 100 the highest growth in all of Australia and New Zealand with the highest percentage of women and Rotarians under the age of 40yrs

Chair Tony P introduced Cr Brooke Patterson to address the Club

Cr Brooke Patterson Councillor for Gold Coast Division 6 now bounded by Ashmore, Bundall, Currumburra Roads and Musgrave Ave, taking over from Dawn Critchlow who held the position for 28yrs. Her objectives for Southport were that 1) it had to be clean and safe 2) had Planning Laws that worked and 3) attracted Government Investment, and proceeded to inform how she was working to achieve those goals with considerable

success. Brooke assured us of her interest and support for Woodroffe Park developed as an inner city landmark area of rest, relaxation and recreation and a celebration of the connection with Southport Rotary and has garnered support from her Council colleagues. Brooke has allocated \$100,000 from her Divisional Funds for a feasibility study in 2021 and hoping for an allocation of \$5,000,000 for the work to be done in 2022-23.

Michael I moved a vote of thanks to Brooke while emphasising the historical connection between Southport Rotary and Southport's development as the modern health and education centre for the Gold Coast.

Pendiri WILLIAM BOOTH The information you shared about the age and numerical decline of the club is something I can empathise with, as a fellow Rotarian. My personal experience of Rotary started in Falkirk (Scotland) in 1998. More recently I have been a member of the International Clubs in Tallinn (Estonia) and Helsinki (Finland). In each of those clubs, the work was shouldered by a handful of committed, but ageing members. Finding ways to attract and recruit new members was a constant board discussion and we regularly faced the issue of declining numbers. Whilst I was only in my late 50's, I was still one of the youngest members in Helsinki International Club! I have not been able to link with a Club in Indonesia (there is no International club in Bandung), so I am currently a lapsed Rotarian. However, in the spirit of Rotary, I salute you and your fellow Rotarians for your faithfulness, hard work and generous contributions, which have surely touched the hearts of many children in Indonesia.




