

#### Rotary Club of Southport Scribes Report: Meeting 5th April, 2016

Chairman **Leanda Cooper** opened the meeting at 6:20pm and led reciting the 4-way Test; she then proposed a toast to the Queen and people of Australia.

**Elisabeth Schuehle** presented the Rotary "Minute" detailing the history of the Rotary Foundation. Proposed by RI President Arch Klumph in 1917 with a single donation of US\$26.50, the endowment fund was renamed Rotary Foundation in 1928. RF has since received contributions totalling more than \$1Billion; more than 1 million individuals have been recognised as Paul Harris Fellows, meaning US\$1,000 has been contributed to RF for each one.

President **Lea Rickwood** welcomed guests and visitors: DGE Michael and Roz Irving, visiting Rotarians and members of the Griffith Satellite Club and Southport Rotaractors.

President Lea reported that Terry Brown from RC Lismore has been nominated for District Governor 2018-19. The period for objections has expired.

Lunches for Eight is scheduled for 10 April with numbers finalised.

Registration for District Conference closes 13 April.

Carousel operators are urged to promote its FaceBook page. Alissa Lean won the prize for March with 40 likes.

**PDG Graham Jones** presented a motion that RC Southport endorse the District Budget. DGE Michael mentioned key points: A modest \$1 increase per Rotarian; focus on Training for office bearers and leaders; and improved Public Relations. **CARRIED** 

Marion Jones has tickets for movie premier for PolioPlus on 14<sup>th</sup> April: "Eddie the Eagle" \$20/head. Peter Overell sought help to fill a couple of shifts for Carousel duties.

Leanda announced the "Aunts & Uncles" picnic organisation is well in hand with Rotaractors overseeing the games.

Leanda read a Thank you Card from Angels Kitchen thanking the Club for donating \$1,000 in memorium of Joan Cronin.

**Secretary Andrew** reported that in attendance were: 26 members, 2 partners, 2 visiting Rotarians, 2 club guests and 7 Rotaractors; a total of 39.

Drole as ever, Sergeant **Duncan Plastow** imposed a flurry of fines on everyone present. Sport fans and those almost named in the Panama financial scandal were particularly targeted. Heads & Tails went to Tony Pritchett; and the raffle was won by Tony Gardner.

**DGE Michael Irving** presented his District Goals for 2017-18. He wore a specially printed high-vis vest boldly emblazoned with "Rotarian at Work" on the back. So far, District sales have exceeded 600. Four clubs, including RC Southport, will receive a Presidential Citation this year.

#### **DISTRICT GOALS**

- 1. DONATE LIFE Organs from one donor benefit 10 others. Australian Organ Donation Registry is administered by Commonwealth Government Department of Human Services and quickly connects to patients awaiting organ transfers. Every club will receive a promotional pack with the aim of registering minimum 10 Donors per club. DONATE LIFE TRANSFORM LIFE
- **2. MEMBERSHIP** "Nobody ever asked me to join Rotary." WHY NOT? Aim: Every Rotarian to invite one person to attend a meeting.
- **3. MENTORING YOUTH** Encourage young people to offer their ideas and feelings. Show that Rotary cares. Potential benefits: RYLArians; Satellite Clubs; Rotaractors.
- **4. AUSTRALIAN HUMANITARIAN PROJECTS** Every club is challenged to undertake a Humanitarian Project in Australia; and to donate \$500 to Outback Links Safari, a District initiative to send tradesmen, apprentices, Rotarians and helpers to Charleville in September, 2016 to provide repairs, maintenance and social interaction to farmers and outback residents suffering

from four years of drought. It is envisaged that minimum 8 -10 properties will be offered help over 5 days. Rotarians are urged to aid with cash or hands-on assistance. A video depicted the objectives for this project.

**5. ROTARY FOUNDATION** All Rotarians are implored to donate US\$26.50 (i.e. AU\$2/week from July – November) honouring the initial donation of US\$26.50 that setup RF in 1917. November is Rotary Foundation Month. Clubs are also requested to run "Purple Pinkie Days" to raise money for PolioPlus. World Polio Day is 24 October.

**DG'S PARTNER'S PROJECT:** Roz Irving presented an insightful overview of her support for the Fred Hollows Foundation whose goal is to eradicate Trachoma in Australia by 2020. Fred Hollows was awarded Rotary Prize for World Peace in 1993, receiving \$100,000 has enabled the FHF to operate for more than 20 years in many countries treating Trachoma and Cataracts, training local doctors and staff to do the operations and to establish localised factories making inter-ocular lenses for as little as \$8. FHF aims to eliminate preventable blindness. To date, 20 million people have had sight restored. Preventable Blindness is TOO BIG to ignore. Roz pointed out that her project is perfectly in tune with RI theme for 2016-17: *Rotary Serving Humanity*. A video highlighted the plight of many people inflicted with eye disease.

Andrew Middleton thanked Michael and Roz for their absorbing presentations. President Lea closed the meeting at 8:05 Tony P.

The bags themselves are not just confined to use once a month but are used all year by the girls as they can carry school gear in them.

These kits make it possible for girls to continue to go to school rather than miss out on vital education. The funds that Southport Rotary donated were used to purchase the waterproof material, and the donations of fabric from friends have enabled my small team to sew over 800 shields & bags for the Days for Girls' Project over the past year.

During the last year Days for Girls sanitary kits have been sent to Nepal, Kenya, Sierra Leone, the Solomons & Cambodia, with the latest batch being delivered to Kenya.
