Applications for the 2022 NYSF Year 12 Program are now open!

The NYSE great'y appreciates Rolary's generous support and promotion of the National Youth Science Forum (NYSE) Year 12 Program in local communities. Last year, 48% of NYSE participants came from remote and regional parts of Australia, thanks to the unique relationship between Rolary and NYSE. We look forward to continuing to work with you and to welcoming students from your area in 2022.

Applications have now opened and soon your Rotary Club is likely to be contacted by Year 11 students seeking endorsement of their applications to attend the NYSE Year 12 Program In January 2022.

Following the outstanding success of this year's program format (modified due to COVID-19), the 2022 NYSF Year 12 Program will run as a 12-day hybrid program. The program is designed to give students a broader understanding of the diverse study and career options available in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM).

During the program, students have the opportunity to:

- participate in tours of science and lechnology facilities;
- learn about cutting-edge research;
- engage with industry partners and research providers;
- learn about study options and STEM career pathways;
- mix with other like-minded students from all over Australia: and
- network with former NYSF participants on STEM-related study and career pathways.

In addition to STEM workshops, participants also participate in sessions on antropreneurship, critical thinking, science communication, working together effectively, and much more. The focus is not solely on academic achievements, but on developing well-rounded individuals who have the skills and confidence to determine their futures.

Application process

Students must apply through the NYSF website *www.nysf.edu.au*. Following feedback from Rotary District Chairs, the application fee for the Program has been reduced to \$25. Students need to pay this application fee as they submit their application, on or before the **closing date of 2 July 2021**. There is no limit on the number of applicants your Club can endorse and no obligation to provide funding along with endorsement to those applicants who are successful.

Mehta, an accountant, is chair of the Skyline Group, a real estate development company he founded He is also a director of Operation Eyesight Universal (India), a Canada-based Mehta has been actively involved in disaster response and is a trustee of ShelterBox, UK. After the 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami, he helped build nearly 500 homes for families affected by the disaster.

He pioneered a program that has performed more than 1,500 life-changing heart surgeries in South Asia. He is also the architect of the TEACH Program, which promotes literacy throughout India and has reached thousands of schools.

A Rotary member since 1984, Mehta has served Rotary as director, member or chair of several committees, zone coordinator, training leader, member of The Rotary Foundation Cadre of Technical Advisers, and district governor. He is also the chair of Rotary Foundation (India).

Mehta has received Rotary's Service Above Self Award and The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Awards.

He and his wife, Rashi, are Major Donors and members of the Bequest Society.organization.

Jeff was born and educated in Sydney. After attaining Arts and Law Degrees from Sydney University, he and his late wife PDG Anne made a "tree change" in 1980 and moved to Murwillumbah to establish a legal practice.
