Scribes Report 2 March

Chair lan opened the meeting with the four way test and toast to the Queen and Australia. Pres Andrew welcomed all pointing out that tonight we did have a quorum with eight members present. He also welcomed ADG Eric Lewis.

Eric said he supported whatever decision the club made about its future. He said that PETS was on this weekend and Southport Club is the only one not attending.

Sergeant Graham Cooper conducted the fines session with Rotary questions about Australian RI presidents and heads and tails was won by Ian C and the raffle by Graham Cooper.

Pres Andrew gave a report on our visit to Broadwater Club saying the venue was very noisy with the rain and their pa system was not working making it hard to hear what was said. He made comment on the apparent age of most members, somewhat like our club. He spoke of some of their projects saying we could be involved with assisting Southport High school set up workshops for handcrafts. The mens' shed may have tools they do not need. He spoke of our two local politicians having us organise a public function for them with us keeping the profits. There is the zoom meeting with Dr. Teo coming up .

We had our meal and then Pres Andrew pointed out that of our 18 members only nine are attendees. Members are having extended periods away. We cannot have just three people doing all the work of the club and handing in our charter and maybe members joining other clubs could be the future. We do enjoy socialising but we do have an old age demographic. He asked should we become a satellite club of Broadwater. We need commitment from members for this to happen.

PDG Michael I said that a satellite club does not require the same commitment as Rotary and we can have social events with our partners involved. We will not have to pay \$100 for a room each gathering. It could give us time to regroup and see if Southport Rotary could be reborn.

Pres Andrew said Brooke Patterson may join such a club and attract similar age group folk. We are handing in our charter at the end of June. Broadwater club has fees of \$350 per member and an extra \$100 if you wish to donate to RF. In addition we would decide our own fees as a satellite club and would attend some of their meetings. One of our members would be on their board and they would have a member on our board.

Peter O asked how each member felt about being in a satellite club and as each member was asked their views many were not in favour of progressing to a satellite club. Andrew said it was sad when we lost seven members when Griffith club was formed and Graham C said he would not pay \$350 to be a pseudo Rotarian. Other clubs may appeal more to members.

Andrew said Southport was a growth area of Gold Coast. We have to accept the vote of all members and have a clear majority if we are to move to a satellite club. It was decided to send a voting slip to all members so the entire club may have input in the decision. Several present made it clear that they would not be part of a satellite club.

Peter O offered his home as the site for our next club meeting on 16 March with takeaway food and drinks provided at a fixed cost.

Here's a bit of background on the Charlie Teo meeting – taken from an update to members. It would be great if your members could join us on the day – when you know the numbers, can you please let me know so we can organise things from our end

Most members will recall that a couple of years ago, the Frizelles Motor Group organised a major car raffle to raise \$100,000 to pay for the costs of Prof. Charlie Teo to perform a brain operation on the partner of one of their staff members. The Club assisted Frizelles by agreeing to be the custodian of the funds raised and the eventual distribution of those funds for the cost of the operation and any subsequent medical treatment.

As it turned out, the costs involved did not reach the \$100,000 and the Club still retains just over \$14,000. We have now gained the agreement of Frizelles that these remaining funds should be released and donated to the Charlie Teo Foundation. Despite his busy schedule, we are very fortunate that Charlie will join us via a Zoom meeting on **Friday 19 March 2021** – don't miss this meeting.

Dear Presidents, Secretaries & AG's (FYI)

Sorry to bombard you with emails, but there is an urgent need for funds to assist the shipping of the packed and completed container to go to Dili. Please see Bren's email below and if you are able to assist, please contact Bren direct - his details appear at the bottom of this email.

"A Container for Guido Vladares National Hospital is now Sealed and ready to go – we just need to find the funds to ship it.

Here is the story of this container.

- The 20 foot Container was originally commenced as a container of medical equipment and supplies for another destination.
- Freight costs to that destination made the project impossible for the original Rotary Sponsor. The container remained unfinished at the RAWCS Northern Depot.
- In September 2020 Dili Rotary Club President Mario De Jesus requested that the National Hospital urgently needed operating theatre lights. Also Hospital Beds and Mattresses. Four sets of theatre lights are in this container.
- Our Rotary Club of Burleigh Heads supported me in taking over responsibility for the container and repacking and tallying the contents to be directed to the Guido Valadares National Hospital in Dili.
- The container has now been completely filled and packed with additional medical supplies and equipment, together with <u>three very modern Dialysis machines</u> after Eddie Da Pina (whom anyone involved in RAWCS projects in Timor will know) spoke with Dr Nilton.
- These machines are worth \$15,000 each.
- The container is sealed and ready to go. RAWCS Project Registration is being finalised and then I must raise the funds for freight. (Estimated around \$8000)
- I will also ensure that funds are available for the landed costs in Timor for "Rotarians Helping Timor" to clear the Container to the National Hospital.
- I am hoping the sale of the 20 foot container may assist with the funds needed.

Attached is the raw tally sheet of the goods in the Container. There are three modern Fresenius Dialysis Machines, together with 4 banks of operating theatre lights, six beds and mattresses and sundry smaller hospital tables, cabinets, and equipment together with a large amount of linen. I am sincerely hoping you may be able to assist me in raising the funds towards getting this container away.


The Latest RAWCS/DIK Newsletter for February is also attached. More help from D 9640 is urgently needed by way of volunteers and donations for freight to help get containers away.
