## Rotary Scribes Report 4 /5/ 21

Chair Jim Scotte opened the meeting inviting all to join him in reciting the 4-Way followed by a Toast to the Queen and the People of Australia before introducing President Andrew.

President Andrew moved to formally accept the resignation of Ian Craig, carried with regret. He then opened a discussion on our meeting format going forward. It was felt that once a month we should follow our traditional format with the other regular meeting being informal.

He tabled a letter from District Club Development Chair, David Baguley advising of training day to be held on the 23<sup>rd</sup> May at the Quality Hotel in Markeri Street, cost covered by District and canvassing if any of us wished to attend.

Our no change Changeover was set for Tuesday the 15<sup>th</sup> of June at the Ferry Road Tavern to which our partners are invited. Meals to be ordered at the bar as usual on arrival. Secretary Tony to advise District. The 29<sup>th</sup> of June being the third Tuesday of the month to be a casual dinner with partners at a restaurant to be arranged and advised by Peter O and Tony P.

**Tony G** gave a Rotary Minute recounting his Rotary experience following leaving Apex having reached the maximum allowable 40yrs of age and being invited by Lionel Perry to a Rotary Meeting. He reminisced on the process and formalities of membership invitation, acceptance and induction of the era and then his involvement in our Club over the years. This included being President 1992-93, hosting a number of exchange students and taking the job of Bulletin Editor following Vince Rehbein.

**Sergeant Tony P** gave a relaxed session fining all who had not had or were booked for the covid vaccine, those not having visited Ulladulla or Pambula and Broncos supporters for their win.

**Heads and Tails** was won by Peter O **Raffle** won by Tony G

Chair Jim S introduced Andrew to talk on horses while advising that 73 people having been killed by horses in the last year made them the most deadly animal.

President Andrew gave a most interesting dissertation on the history of horses in South Africa and Australia. The first 7 horses in Australia arrived with the first fleet and came from South Africa which had prior first imported horses from Java in 1653 then Arabians to develop the Cape horse as a work horse. Australia then bred the Waler horse of which 140,000 were sent to India in WW1. The most successful cavalry charge was by allied forces largely Australians over 6km against the Turks and Germans, intimidating and overwhelming them at Beer Sheba.

In 1902 we were involved in the Boer war, Australia's first war, sending 43,000 horses to the battle that in total involved 519,000 horses 106,000 donkeys and mules that on average survived just 6 weeks. The Russians lost 179,000 horses in 2 months during one campaign. Andrew's forebear GM Middleton was a noted horse breeder in South Africa breeding Waler and Boerperd horses gaining him respect from English and Afrikaans alike. There is a Waler Horse Owners and Breeders Association in Australia being a very sought after breed as a stock horse playing major role in our exploration and livestock industry and featuring widely in our Brumby population.

Sadly worldwide there are only 4 statues in the world honouring the "War Horse" The meeting showed appreciation by acclamation




