Southport Rotary was well represented at last night's combined meeting with Parkwood Rotary. Ten members, two partners and guest, Tatiana, enjoyed a happy gathering at the Arundel Tavern. Ashmore and Robina were also represented.

Sharon and Pete Crean, now residents of Kenya, delivered a passionate account of their not-for-profit organisation, *BeyondWater*, which operates in Eastern Africa, bringing clean, safe drinking water to communities. Their enthusiasm and dedication to this cause has brought relief and improved health to many people in a number of African countries.

Their interesting presentation was particularly relevant for March is Rotary's *Water and Sanitation Month*.

Next Tuesday, 6pm we visit OzHarvest, in Surfers Paradise. The volumes of surplus food OzHarvest gathers from supermarkets and then redistributes to organisations providing meals to disadvantaged folk are truly astonishing. ### Scribe report 5 March 2019

The meeting was a joint meeting with the Parkwood Rotary Club at the Arundel Tavern. It was a full meeting with visitors from Ashmore, Southport and Robina Clubs. The meeting opened at 6:30pm and all members, guests and visiting Rotarians were welcomed

The format was different from our normal meetings with the guest speaker presenting first, followed by dinner and fellowship.

The guest speakers, Sharon and Peter Crean, spoke passionately about the charity they established BeyondWater.

BeyondWater is a not-for-profit organisation working across East Africa. Their focus is on ensuring schools, medical clinics, childrens' home and remote communities have access to safe, clean drinking water and sanitation facilities.

This includes providing deep bore wells, guttering, water tanks, hand washing facilities, toilets and health education programmes.

BeyondWater is registered as a trust both in New Zealand and Kenya, and as a charity in Australia.

Founded in November 2007 by Pete and Sharon Crean when they were living in Sydney. They were presented with the fact that one billion people don't have access to safe, clean drinking water and another two billion don't have the use of a toilet - something we take for granted here in Australia. They gathered a team of volunteers who were enthusiastic in doing something to alleviate poverty in East Africa and started BeyondWater.

12 years later they have been able to give over 100,000 people across East Africa sustainable solutions and a way out of poverty.

The presentation included photos of the work being done and Peter talked about the current initiative that is underway to provide clean water to the New Frontiers Health Force Ngoswani, Kenya. 


