An Invitation from Broadwater Club to a special event.

Here's a bit of background on the Charlie Teo meeting – taken from an update to members. It would be great if your members could join us on the day – when you know the numbers, can you please let me know so we can organise things from our end

Most members will recall that a couple of years ago, the Frizelles Motor Group organised a major car raffle to raise \$100,000 to pay for the costs of Prof. Charlie Teo to perform a brain operation on the partner of one of their staff members. The Club assisted Frizelles by agreeing to be the custodian of the funds raised and the eventual distribution of those funds for the cost of the operation and any subsequent medical treatment.

As it turned out, the costs involved did not reach the \$100,000 and the Club still retains just over \$14,000. We have now gained the agreement of Frizelles that these remaining funds should be released and donated to the Charlie Teo Foundation. Despite his busy schedule, we are very fortunate that Charlie will join us via a Zoom meeting on **Friday 19 March 2021** – don't miss this meeting.

- Cyril Richarde, A Remarkable Southport Rotarian

Cyril Richarde and his sister became orphaned when both of their parents died in 1917. He became a carpenter working in rural Victoria and Melbourne, before coming to the Gold Coast in 1957. He was inducted into Southport Rotary club on November 18, 1958 and began an extraordinary journey of Rotary community service. Cyril's childhood strongly influenced his Rotary service. His sister had been a victim of Polio, so it was not surprising that he soon arranged for children with Polio in the Xavier Home for Crippled Children in Brisbane to have a Rotary beach holiday, a project that Southport Rotary supported for many years.

In 1962 whilst President of Southport Rotary, Cyril and PDG Keith Hopper (Rotary Club of Inverell) agreed to provide teams to visit Indonesia to build schools and hospitals. To obtain subsidised transport from QANTAS for powdered milk for Indonesian children, a project title was needed, which became "Fourth Arm In Action" FAIM. Cyril undertook 23 tours of duty to FAIM projects in Indonesia and Papua New Guinea. Cyril provided a billy which was first circulated at Southport Rotary Club meetings in 1965 to defray the cost of powdered milk for FAIM projects. Donations to Cyril's billy have also supported schools in Kiribati, as well sponsoring the education of needy children in Indonesia. Rotarians and other donors contributed \$110 per child each year to enable children in Indonesian orphanages to attend PRIMARY school. Later when primary education was supported by the government the project funded secondary and tertiary education for children from Salvation Army orphanages at a similar cost. After sole-managing this project, "Sponsoring Education for Children in Indonesia" for more than thirty years Cyril passed the management reins to PDG Alan Still (Burleigh Heads); followed by Bill Bonner (Stanthorpe). Renamed "Empowering Indonesian Children for a Brighter Future" it continued as a RAWCS project under the auspices of the Rotary Club of Southport until 2020 when the Salvation Army in Indonesia was no longer able to manage this project in accordance with the project's aims and objectives. In its final year to 30th June, 2020 the project raised \$15,430 to provide improved education for 209 children. The project was funded by more than seventy-three Rotary Clubs from every Rotary District in Australia as well as forty-one individual donors.

Over its fifty-six year span the project funded improved education for hundreds, possibly thousands, of impoverished Indonesian children. Cyril was awarded an AM for his commitment to the education of Indonesian children.

In 1986, Cyril's eyesight became impaired. He decided that Blind and Vision Impaired people of the Gold Coast needed a meeting hall. Within two years he had obtained a grant of land and raised \$140,000 to construct the meeting hall, with Rotarians donating professional services to this project.

Cyril died in 2013, aged 100. In his will he created a fund, administered by Southport Rotary, to assist the education of needy children. Southport Rotary honours this indefatigable Rotarian who personified SERVICE BEYOND SELF.

Membership Dues

- Southport Rotary Club members will become members of Broadwater Southport Club.
- Invoices for membership dues will be issued by Broadwater Southport Club.
- Broadwater Southport Club does not subsidise the cost membership fees.
- Current membership dues are \$350 per annum discount of \$25 offered if paid before 30 June.
- The \$350 covers the cost of RI dues, District dues & insurance, Rotary Downunder and Club Runner subscriptions and a small contribution to administration costs. Other administration costs are covered from profits coming from Chapel operations, Sergeant's fines and breakfast costs.

Financial Management

- Apart from the management of membership dues, each Club will manage their own finances.
- Each Club will maintain separate bank accounts.
- Each Club will be accountable for arranging the audit of financial accounts both Clubs currently use Allen & Wolfe
- Each Club shall exchange monthly and YTD P&L's to maintain a level financial oversight. *This was NOT discussed but I think we should be doing this*

Meeting Arrangements

- Southport Rotary meet on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays dinner meeting at Ferry Road Tavern this venue may change as a fee of \$100 has just been imposed for the hire of the function room.
- Each Club will maintain their own meeting arrangements but members will be encouraged to attend the other Club's meetings from time to time
- The dinner/breakfast meeting mix may suit some members but not others.

Service Projects

- Southport Rotary Club does not have any projects at this time some members volunteer at the Men's Shed
- Southport Rotary members would be happy to participate in any projects of Broadwater Southport

Board membership

- As a satellite club, Southport Rotary does not have to have a Board may only have a Chair and other selected positions
- The Chair of the satellite club would sit on the Board of Broadwater Southport

Formation Date

- Agreed to work towards date of 1 July 2021
- Working backwards, we need to establish the critical deadlines RI and District approvals, Club member approvals, etc – Andrew M to investigate and advise all

Each Club to obtain approval of their members – agreed on a simple two-thirds majority vote
