Tony Stenton had kindly offered to donate \$1000 to pay for room hire at Ferry Rd Tavern and the tavern had halved the asking price to \$50 per meeting. It was decided that we would return to the Tavern for the foreseeable future starting on our meeting of 20 April. The Tavern is to be notified of our intentions. It was suggested that we have some social nights with our partners during the year and possibly take advantage of the fifth Tuesdays for some socials

Members felt that having a stable meeting place would benefit the club and make it easier for visitors to attend. The offer made by Tony Pritchett for a meeting at his his home is to be explored when he returns at the end of April and make it a social night with our partners.

The district secretary was asking to be notified when we will be having our changeover dinner but as the present executive is continuing in the role this event is not really necessary. More discussion will be held on this matter and the DG notified.

Our club needs a representative to vote at the conference in May on our behalf. It was suggested Michael Irving be approached and he subsequently accepted the role.
