# **Rotary Club of Southport** SCRIBE'S REPORT 7 SEPTEMBER, 2021

Chairman, Graham Cooper, opened the meeting at 6:15pm. Members recited the 4-way test and toasted the Queen and people of Australia.

Acting **President Michael Irving** welcomed the seven members in attendance.

Acting President Michael spoke about his long-held interest in demographics and his research into the change in Rotary membership over past decades. Membership is in serious decline throughout most Districts but clubs in country towns and regional areas are faring much better than clubs in densely populated towns and cities. For example, Michael's late father's Rotary club of Brisbane once had more than 100 members; in 2021 it has only 36, whereas Murwillumbah Rotary Club, in a town of about ten thousand people has 75 members. Satellite clubs set up by Rotary Clubs in rural areas have been highly successful. Women Rotarians have a higher membership retention rate than

men and are more likely to attract other women to join. The success of new clubs seems to be related to their "cause-based" foundations which promote projects that appeal to younger people. He cited the recent chartering of the Rotary Club of Koala Lovers at Currumbin as an example. Michael advised that he has attempted, without success, to communicate with Griffith University about the possibility of setting up a grant for text books for student(s) from Indonesia/Pacific Islands. He will continue to make contact and report back.

It was noted that the DG's visit to our club is scheduled for Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> October, subject to no Covid-19 restrictions. Members resolved to make that meeting a partner's night with everyone ordering their meal downstairs as for normal meetings.

H&T was won by Graham Cooper; raffle was won by Lionel Perry.

The next meeting is Tuesday, September 21<sup>st</sup>. Chair Graham closed the meeting at 7:40pm.

Two of our District's Youth Programs, the Rotary Youth Transition Seminar (RYTS) and Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) are now **open for applications**.

- <!--[if !supportLists]-->• <!--[endif]-->RYTS is aimed at students in their senior years of school (years 11-12) or who are aged between 17-18 if not within a school system. The program has a focus to assist the transition from one area of study into the next phase of life. It will run from 17<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2022. Further information and links for applications can be found on our District website (<u>www.rotary9640.org/page/ryts</u>).
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->• <!--[endif]-->**RYLA is aimed at young people aged 19-29** and will run from 25<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> January 2022. The program is a personal, professional development camp which focuses on enhancing leadership, communication, motivation, teamwork and interpersonal skills. Further information and links for applications can be found on our District website (www.rotary9640.org/page/rotary-youth=leadership-awards).

Our venue for both camps is Bornhoffen PCYC in Natural Bridge, QLD. **We are accepting applicants from both QLD and NSW** as we hope by January that border restrictions are no longer in place. With limited spaces available at each camp, we urge applicants to apply early. Should COVID restrictions at the time prevent NSW residents from attending a refund would be available.

**Clubs can sponsor as many attendees as they wish to either camp.** You will be invoiced in full for each person you sponsor (less the \$100 deposit payable by RYLA applicants). However, you are free to determine how much of that cost is covered by your club or the applicant – further details are on the respective website pages.

Please be aware that the **applications will only be accepted online** via the links on the website pages. For each submitted application sponsored by your club we will send an email containing the details of the application and asking you to confirm / approve (an additional email will also be triggered for RYTS applicants asking their parent / guardian to approve).


