Directors Reports.

Graham J reported that almost \$250,000 had been raised by the Malaria Vaccine Committee and that clinical trials are to commence.

Leana C sought help to paint a Girl Guides Hut.

Andrew M relayed the thanks of Fr John of Tanzania for our assistance

Pres Rhonda reminded us of the French dinner next week and of our strategic planning meeting on 14 November. She displayed the club business cards she has had printed and asked for names for the Christmas party on 12 December at the Hugh and Nancy Smith home.

Graham J took names to visit the University Hospital for a tour on Sunday 12 November.

Secretary Marion reported an attendance of 30 for the night.

Regina Tucker was called up and Rhonda presented a cheque for the Malaria appeal from carousel funds. Regina thanked the club on behalf of the Glycomics institute of Griffith.

Prof John was then presented a cheque by pres Rhonda to assist his STEM project.

He expressed his great appreciation and said he was convinced a change to students' view of science, maths and other subjects will be the eventual result.

Michael I conducted a fine session related to the history of polio, members paying if they did not know the answers. Type 2 virus is now eliminated with the huge assistance of Rotary.

Raffle winner Neil R.

Michael I introduced Prof Richard John to give his talk.

Prof John is Project lead of the Qld STEM Education Network and has a PhD in chemistry. He is a lecturer and scientist at Griffith Uni Gold Coast campus. STEM stands for Science,

Technology/Engineering/Maths. He has served on and chaired many committees at Griffith but still finds time to establish a new project. With a diverse team they have produced a set of 24 "Home Readers" based on the Australian curriculum Science. This is an educational tool for teachers, for pupils in prep and grades 1 and 2.

Four books were distributed and discussed. When teaches were asked about a computer version they requested a large scale version for classroom work.

Rotary has supported this work and funds from the carousel have assisted with printing and distribution costs. The past week has seen over 1000 schools being sent a supply of books.

Graham Jones gave a vote of thanks and presented a certificate of appreciation.

Rhonda reminded all of our French night next week and said that all seats were taken. Meeting closed at 8.05PM






