Scribes Report 21 July 2020

Chair Peter O opened the meeting a few minutes early with the four way test and toast to the Queen and Australia., President Andrew welcomed all present at the meeting explaining he has not been well but his corona test was negative so he is safe to be with us. He mentioned that we had a lot to discuss tonight as we plan the future of the club. Peter O then invited Merv P to give a Rotary minute. He said he is soon to have a holiday at Hervey Bay so he looked up the history of Rotary there. The first club was chartered in 1984. Clubs that are or have been there are Hervey Bay, Hervey Bay Sunrise and Hervey Bay City. Problems with ageing membership have existed there and HB city and HB have merged and meet on Wednesdays at the Hervey Bay Hotel. One of their projects has been an annual Garden Expo with \$300,000 raised so far. Lionel P said there is a great Meals on Wheels there.

Directors Reports.

Tony P said a correction has been made to the annual report as Rotary Foundation was owed \$1200 and this has now been paid. A sapphire Paul Harris for Hugh Smith was found in our cupboard and will be given to him.. An invitation to our 75th Anniversary Dinner will be extended to him.

Tony S was invited to conduct the fines session and started by telling of his corona lockdown activity in establishing a vegie garden. It has been most successful but the total cost of the crop was many times the price in the supermarket. Other members shared similar stories.

Raffle winner - Duncan P (he did forget to take his wine with him as he left early) Our attendance tonight was eleven members.

Pres Andrew mentioned that he thought we no longer needed a Blue Card. New rules apply from August and the new card must have a photo. The club secretary is able to sign applications for members. He asked what we should do about Cyril Richarde's billy as the charity is no longer supported by the club. It was decided to discontinue it.

Signatories on the club accounts were discussed. Treasurer Merv said most banking is done electronically. Merv and Andrew should be on this list and Tony P and Graham C should be approved to stay on.

Andrew said we have become a cashless society and we should be using the program SQUARE purchased from Office works attached to a mobile phone for club tap and go. The men shed was discussed and what will become of club funds in the future will have to be decided. With such a small board Andrew wants all members involved in club decisions in the future. He said he would rather have the Rotary minute talk about our history. The satellite club still seems a good idea for the future. He asked Tony P to continue to follow it up and when it is allowed have meetings again and have Sharon Randall be the person chasing membership.

The literacy project in Africa providing literacy kits for schools in Tanzania is now in some disarray as we have problems tracing where our funds are going. Andrew was in Africa two years ago and found that books often go missing. Suggested the funds be sent to the Rotary Club of White River and let them choose the schools and keep us informed. He told us that \$1500 will buy 54 book packs.

The meals started arriving after 7.00PM so we had a short break.

The Cronin and Hobart scholarships were discussed and the ways winners are chosen for each. Funds are available to finance these. The awardees for this year will be invited to a club meeting to tell us about themselves. We have spent \$3000 this year so far.

Andrew then raised the topic of where the club will go in the future. We have 17 members but only 13 of these attend meetings. We are a club of older Rotarians and we must consider how much longer we can survive. We have \$14,000 in our youth account but we need to decide what we will do in the next 12 to 18 months.

Discussion followed on our 75th anniversary dinner in August and Tony S offered to contact the Southport Golf Club re costs. numbers allowed and dates available. Discussion about who should be invited as club guests and which clubs should be approached to attend due to past history with our club. Club history should feature on the night and we will not have a sergeant. Michael I will be asked if he can help with this.. A suitable guest speaker will be found and other speakers will be limited to two minutes. All this will have to be organised as soon as possible so invitations can be sent out. Tony P has offered to set up an on line booking system for payment.

Andrew said we were happy with the venue of the tavern and our frequency of meeting there.

Discussion about the proposed development of the land where the Rotary hall stood resulted in news that estimated cost is one million dollars and it could take two years to get all approvals. The meeting with councillor Brooke Patterson was fruitful and she is to raise it with the mayor. Other projects the club could support are Meals on Wheels and the Mens' Shed and club funds could be used to support these.

A large amount of Rotary material was brought out of the cupboard at the Tavern and decisions on what to keep or ditch will be made. Greg Dux has an unused shade sail, which can be sold.

Peter O suggested we have occasional social meetings such a Sunday lunch in the park. He then read the duty roster for our next meeting on 4 August.

Pres Andrew encouraged us all to have fun as members and the n closed the meeting at 8.05PM
