Scribes Report 21 September 2021

With a gathering of seven members chair **Tony P** opened the meeting at 6.15PM with the four way test and loyal toast.

President Andrew announced that PDG Michael I has asked to be put on the excused attendance list as he fulfils the requirements for this. He said he has been hoping to have the recipients of the Hobart and Cronin scholarships to attend one of our meetings. One is working on the Sunshine coast and the Cronin recipient has been given the funds by Griffith

Uni and will be urged to come to a meeting. Jonathan Zervis has asked to be excused from attending meetings at the moment but has paid his subs.

Peter O gave a Rotary minute about the latest news from the mens' shed where a hammer thrower has caused concern with his proximity to people. Little athletics will be extending their grounds and a new shed and recreational area 24X18 M is planned adjacent to the present building. It will have a toilet block and a covered area. Ashmore Rotary is not involved. Peter O raised the point that club funds go to new developments and what would happen if a women's shed was built. Discussion followed on the complexity in this modern world of varied groups defined by sex.

Pres Andrew discussed the contents of the message he had sent to members containing the two proposals from Griffith Uni re the planned use of the funds from Cyril Richarde. Two proposals were put forward by the representatives from Griffith Uni the first of which had the Hobart, Cronin and Richarde funds under a common umbrella at Griffith and Southport Rotary clearly identified as the instigator of the funds. With the proposal to use the Richarde funds to provide funds to buy books or necessary equipment for needy overseas students. We would create a list of the countries involved and how many students would benefit each year. A sum of \$1350 was proposed in Andrew's discussions with Michael I. Griffith would select recipients and they need to be studying a course that would provide a benefit to the country of origin. There is a sum of \$35,000 available.

The funds in the Hobart and Cronin scholarships are secure. We would need to know how the funds were spent and we should be involved in interviewing applicants. Further discussion with Griffith will be held and we will endeavour to have their representative address one of our meetings.

From ADG Eric Lewis

Please review the following re the upcoming 'Rotary Train Ride to End Polio' We'll also discuss at our Cluster 6 Zoom meeting next Wednesday. I would appreciate it if you would distribute the information to your members and determine if you and your clubs would like to participate.

The 2021 Rotary Train Ride to End Polio will take place on Friday, 22 October.

This year's ride will feature in the Rotary International magazine as well as in Rotary Down Under's magazine. With the promise of a feature in the Rotary International magazine, this is also the ideal opportunity to showcase district 9640 (and of course the Gold Coast) to Rotarians all over the world.

District 9640 has made two major changes to this year's program:

Route Change - Gold Coast Centric

We have changed our route to include only the Gold Coast's main train stations starting at Varsity Lakes and finishing at Helensvale station.

At Helensvale station we will transfer to the G-Link tram travelling to the Broadbeach South stop and back to Helensvale station.

The last leg will be on the main train again from Helensvale to Varsity Lakes station.

Time Change - Morning

We have also changed from a midday ride to an early morning peak-time ride starting at 07:10 am and finishing at 09:52am to allow as many Rotarians as possible to participate in the ride and to get maximum exposure.

I have attached the train and G-link roster for the ride on the 22nd October for your consideration.

There are two ways that your club can participate in the event:

Rotarians can either meet the train or tram at any of the stations for a photo opportunity (bring you club banner and/or your ceremonial cheque with you for display);

AND

Rotarians could complete the ride or part of the ride on the train and/or tram entering and leaving at any of the listed stations.

The more participants, the merrier!

Our aim is to create awareness amongst the general public about the Polio Plus program and about Rotary.

Should you wish to learn more about the ROTARY TRAIN RIDE TO END POLIO, please feel free to contact either Letitia de Lima (Polio Plus Chair) or Phil Fairweather (Foundation Chair), both members of the District 9640 Rotary Foundation Committee, to discuss the program. We also have a very informative PowerPoint presentation that can be presented to you or your club using Zoom as a meeting platform.
