Polio Update from Hugh:

From 1 January—5 March this year there have been no reported confirmed cases of the wild poliovirus anywhere in the world.

However: that is not to say we have finished the job. We still have work to do; particularly as we are seeing what they call "circulating vaccine derived polio" occurring in parts of the world. This has lead to research into a new polio vaccine (Novel Oral Polio Vaccination Type 2) which has been found to reduce the number of cases with the circulating vaccine derived polio.

Making sure that sufficient numbers of people are immunized will assist in keeping occurrences low.

INTERNATIONAL TOAST—THE LETTER 'F'

This week we toasted the Rotary Club of Faversham. I picked this place because I know someone who lives in Faversham. The Rotary Club was chartered in 1948 and meets on Tuesday evenings at the Faversham Golf Club, in Belmont Park. Their first meeting each month focuses on committee meetings.

Their President, Doug Rogers, has happily inducted 4 new members recently.

Today their club is hosting a Music Quiz in aid of "Mary's Meals" a charity dedicated to providing meals for children who live in the poorest countries—to encourage children to go to school, and giving them the energy and focus to learn and hope for a better future.

In May they will be hosting a Family bike Ride—to raise funds for charity.

In the lead up to Christmas they held a number of Christmas Carol Float nights which raised over 5000.00 pounds.

They have formal links with several Rotary Clubs in Europe and keep in touch through collaborating on projects, or having weekends for joint fellowship each year. Sometimes all clubs are involved.
