This week our Rotary toast was to the Rotary Club of Ahuriri in Napier, New Zealand

This club was chartered in October of 1968, and sponsored by the Napier Rotary Club (which had been established in 1924). Ahuriri is a Maori word for what they called Napier before white settlement.

The club has provided funds to establish walking and bike pathways, children's playground, seat benches in parks, and raised funds to support the elderly and the needy in their community. They also provide leadership opportunities through sponsorship to the youth.

They meet every Monday evening at 5.30 pm at The West Shore Beach Inn. They are part of District 9930

OUR GUEST SPEAKERS THIS MORNING WERE JIM AND JANE FROM UMBRELLAS AND FOOTPRINTS AND THE BROLLY BRIGADE

Jim and Jane are heavily involved in finding ways to assist the homeless and those who just want to find opportunities for social

interaction. They provide a mobile shower service, which is often teamed up with other services providing clothes washing facilities, provision of food and even providing hair cuts for those who need it.

Their research suggests that poverty is becoming an ever increasing issue for many more people. Someone on a mean way of \$70,000 per year would be looking at spending 50% of their annual income on housing—when it can be found. Over 100,000 children are poverty stricken, including about 7,000 of those who are homeless.

Their shower truck is often in Victoria Park, Moore Street (near McIver Station); and in Joondalup. It was suggested we go and check them out and see how our Rotary Club can provide further assistance to their programme. Let's do it.
