Ascot members and partners served morning tea at the launch of Ride against Domestic Violence on Sunday in support of Starick and the fantastic work they do in our community and this morning Mike announced the Board's approval of a further grant of \$7,800 towards their Safer Homes program. Geographe Education Support Centre

Teacher Alison travelled up from the South West to pick up two Brick PlayTubs that we have donated to the Geographe Education Support Centre in Busselton which caters for 45 students with Intellectual Disabilities.

Peter accompanied Alison this morning as the grandfather of a 12 year old who attends the school and he told us of the enormous pressures on parents of kids with disabilities. He spoke highly of the school and its teachers and of the invaluable help they give to the families of their students and so he sincerely thanked Ascot for supporting the school.

It is one of only two schools in the state that cover from Kindy to Year 12. Although they have a split campus with Primary students based on the grounds of a local Primary School and the High School Students campus on the grounds of the High School they operate as a separate school. They aim to offer their students best practises in education and all students participate in not only strong literacy and numeracy programs but in programs that offer opportunities to develop their creativity and thinking skills. Alison said our donation of Lego bricks will provide them with endless opportunities to improve their fine motor skills and their ability to follow instructions, think creatively, share with others and improve their oral language.


In thanking the Rotary Club of Ascot, Alison said we have no idea how much it will help their kids nor how excited they are and she has been given strict instructions to get back to Busselton as quickly as possible so they can get started. No coffee stops on the way home for Alison!

We thank Alison for driving up to personally pick up the tubs and look forward to seeing some photos of the school's creative learning in progress. Have fun kids!

President Ron gave a brief recap of the recent **Rotary District 9465 Conference at Margaret River** and said it was a great venue and a most successful event with about 450 attending. He was most impressed with the 10 inspirational speakers but one stood out for him and he told us of young **Vincent Pettinicchio**, who at 7 years of age began to donate comfort kits to improve the lives of the homeless of Perth.

Now 12, Vincent spoke of his passion and his charity work that has inspired many hundreds of other kids and their parents to help him provide, since2013, over 4000 kits containing blankets, pillows, towels and toiletries to those sleeping rough.

Last year Vincent raised \$100,000 and even slept out in the streets of Kings Cross to raise awareness there. He has already received numerous awards for his charitable work, including a Paul Harris Fellow in 2016, and with so much negativity about today's youth, Vincent is an amazing example to not just other youngsters but to all of us. Starick and the Ride Against Domestic Violence 2018

Members and partners of our Club served morning tea on Sunday at the Launch of the Ride Against Domestic Violence which will see teams of riders cycle from Busselton to Perth in May to increase public awareness and raise funds for seven refuges including Starick House. These facilities provide short term safety for women and children fleeing family and domestic violence and Catherine, a recipient of help at one of the refuges told us of the life changing assistance she and her daughter received and how it helped her to go on to become a welfare worker herself and she is now helping others.



This year's riders include a number of our state's members of parliament, union and industry leaders and representatives from business and community foundations and who know, next year we may have our own team in the ride with our keen cyclist Michael Metcalf already showing considerable interest!

On behalf of **Starick** and CEO Leanne Barron, Wendy Wiley, their Board Chair thanked Pres Ron and Ascot members for our support at this event and for the \$7,800 we have donated towards their **Safer Homes project** to improve security in their client's homes in the Belmont area. Starick is the lead agency in Perth's south-east metro corridor but the area sadly has the greatest incidences of domestic violence in not only WA but in Australia. The staggering and ugly truth is that in Australia today, almost two women are killed every week by a current or former partner and one in three women have experienced physical or sexual violence perpetrated by someone known to them. The number of reportable assaults in WA rose by a staggering 77% between 2009 and 2014 and it is an ongoing crisis!
