### **Ngala – Parenting with Confidence**

Ngala, once known to many Perth families as the go-to place for parents to learn sleep and settling techniques for restless newborn babies, is today, much, much more than that.

Ngala's story began in the 1890's as The House of Mercy, a refuge and maternity home for "the fallen women of the colony". It later became known as Alexandra House for Women and most babies born in these facilities were fostered or adopted out, leaving significant impacts for many women and children alike. This practise continued until 1980's.

In 1951 they opened the Mothercraft Training School and in 1955 they became known as Ngal-a, from the Aboriginal Noongar language meaning "We two – mother and child". They soon added infant health training for registered nurses and midwives and over the years added more services including Ngala Helpline, DadsWA and childcare centres.

Today, many Ngala services, including Ngala Parenting Line, support older children and teens and having taken on the State Government's help line in 2016 they attend calls from 8am until 8pm, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Since Jan 2017, an amazing 187,705 parents, carers, families, and professionals have sought out Ngala's assistance. Almost 23,000 of these have been either in person or by phone with the balance through their fabulous website with enquiries coming from 190 countries around the world.

CEO Fiona said in 2018 Ngala has 3 key focus areas. These are Family Services and Parenting Line, Children's Services and Community Services. They have added 9 more services recently which require ongoing upskilling and staffing but have not received additional Government Funding and Fiona is hoping that the Rotary Club of Ascot will be able to assistant with their latest local childcare service right here in Belmont.

Ngala, a Not For Profit organisation, have recently opened an Early Learning and Development Service near the Perth's Domestic Airport for zero to six year olds giving parents working around the airport an opportunity to have their children cared for close to work. They have an open door learning policy where children are encouraged to explore without undue boundaries. Fiona said one of the unexpected benefits parents were finding in its location is that they are able to spend the drive home chatting and engaging with their children. The Belmont area saw 660 births in 2017 with 23% of their families attended a Ngala early parenting program.

Fiona is passionate about giving children the best possible start in life and highlighted the importance of early development in children in the first few years of their lives. She demonstrated that a baby's brain weighs about 400grams and its growth is rapid until about age three when it weighs about 1100grams. This is just shy of the weight of a full grown adult's brain which averages between 1300-1400grams.

Sadly only 46% of babies born develop in an enabled environment and the balance will have some delay in their brain growth and progress. Some children never recover that lost ground and at risk factors include poverty, social isolation and addiction which are all ever present in our local community.

We wish to thank Fiona and the ladies from The Friends of Ngala who came along to tell us of the amazing work that Ngala does, the services they provide and the passion they have for our future generations.




#### **BRICK PLAYTUBS**

The Rotary Club of Ascot made further donations of PlayTubs this week and handed over tubs to another two groups at Tuesday's Meeting.



### **Timor Leste Water Project**

Over the past few years we have helped over 5,000 people in Timor Leste by raising funds to purchase pipes, tanks and taps to bring fresh drinking water down from mountain springs to remote hillside villages and schools and to build much needed ablution blocks.

## WATER PROJECT IN TIMOR LESTE

In 2011 the Rotary Club of Ascot were given the opportunity to become involved in undertaking a "Water and Sanitary" project in Timor Leste. The project involved funds being provided so fresh water from a water source 2,000 metres above sea level could be piped to surrounding hamlets via PVC pipe-line, water tanks and is gravity fed.

The first of many projects was completed with clean water and toilets being installed and is being enjoyed by some 5,000 inhabitants.

Prior the installation of water tanks, village children had to walk several kms to the water source, namely the rivers. Whilst the rivers look clean, unfortunately they are contaminated and this caused 100% sickness within the communities. Invariably the task to collect the water fell on the children making the return trips to collect adequate daily water supplies did not attend school,

Our club over the past 7 years has raised various dollars to support this cause which can never end. We have to date finished 8 separate projects in the surrounding area having raised over \$200,000 for the cause.

One of the major positives of the projects is that the funds raised have purchased the supplies locally in Timor Leste and the local people have undertaken, with supervision, all the labour and installation of pipes and the building of the toilet blocks.

There is ongoing education to locals regarding maintenance so all work completed is ensured of the sustainability of the projects. This in turn allows the children to attend school for further education which will benefit the community in the future.

Our project is registered under the banner of "Rotary Australia World Community Services Ltd" (RAWCS). This is a TAX DEDUCTABLE project for donations made either by individuals, businesses or corporate organisation.


