What's been happening at Ascot this week:

President Ron reported after his return from reviewing our Water Tanks and Pipes Projects in Timor Leste with Mike and Ann that in general the projects are all operating well and in a sustainable way and there are observable health benefits in the children and other members of the communities.

However, two small maintenance issues were noted and he requested funding approval for \$2500 for:

- 1 At Madade in the highlands behind Bakhita the ground under one tank is subsiding. The village will relocate this to firmer ground but require cement, sand and piping and to make water more accessible, require two additional 4000 litre tanks.
- 2 At Mulara near Hatolia the poly pipe spans a series of pools and trickles but, during the wet season, is being disconnected to protect it when they turn into raging torrents. They propose to raise the pipe by attaching it to tensioned wire between two 15 metres posts. This will enable the village to access the pure spring water all year round.

Pres Ron's motion was seconded by Hugh and funds were duly approved. We'll hear more about this project in a few weeks.

Club Directors Vision for 2017/2018

Due to the absence this morning of many of our Directors the scheduled presentation and discussion of the Club's plans for this year did not go ahead.



Instead Peter ran a Sergeant's session with a difference where everyone was asked to fine someone and an around-the-table "Pass the Parcel" style talk on "our Most Embarrassing Moments" which resulted in more than a few laughs.

Hugh also advised he had attended the "Network 18" Membership Seminar on the weekend and it was well attended, had good speakers and good content which would all be made available to the clubs to aid their search for new members. He also gave examples of clubs doing well at the moment in this endeavour including the Rotary Club of Victoria Park which has just inducted 5 new young members and the new Rotary Club of Elizabeth Quay who have about 30 young members but are now looking to induct older members to become mentors to them!

Our Plans and Vision for the Year will be detailed at a later date when illness, travel, family and business commitments don't all conspire to keep our Director's away. Watch this space!

Stephen showed a draft version of our new Bricktober Ad which will hit our Facebook pages and Websites shortly, hopefully later this week.



PLANT A TREE PROJECT - Rotary: Making a Difference

Rotary International President Ian HS Riseley has asked all clubs to participate saying protecting the environment and curbing climate change are essential to Rotary's goal of sustainable service. He challenged every Rotary club to make a difference by planting a tree for each of its members between the start of the Rotary year on 1 July and Earth Day on 22 April 2018. Trees remove carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases from the air, which slows global warming.

"It is my hope that the result of that effort will be far greater than the environmental benefit that those 1.2 million new trees will bring," Riseley said. "I believe the greater result will be a Rotary that recognizes our responsibility not only to the people on our planet, but to the planet itself."

Australian Rotary Health

Australian Rotary Health is one of the largest independent funders of mental health research within Australia.

We also provide funding into a broad range of general health areas; provide scholarships for rural medical and nursing students, as well as Indigenous health students. Australian Rotary Health provides funding into areas of health that do not readily attract funding, and promotes findings to the community.

Australian Rotary Health is a project of the Rotary Districts of Australia and is supported by Rotary Clubs. We have a broad vision to improve the health and wellbeing of all Australians.

Australian Rotary Health provides funding into four focus areas, and promotes findings to the community:



Mental Health Research

Since the year 2000, Australian Rotary Health has focused its funding on mental health research. In 2012 this focus narrowed to the Mental Health of Young Australians, and in 2013 research projects focusing on the Prevention of Mental Health Disorders were included.

There are three ways we fund mental health research: Mental Health Research Grants, Ian Scott PhD Scholarships, Postdoctoral Fellowships



General Health Research

Australian Rotary Health engages with a variety of funding partners to provide Research Grants and PhD Scholarships. These projects encompass a broad range of general health areas including cancer, heart disease, children's health, motor neuron disease, diabetes and more.

There are two ways we fund general health research: Funding Partner PhD Scholarships, Research Companion PhD Scholarships



Indigenous Health Scholarships

These Scholarships support Indigenous students to undertake tertiary training in nursing, physiotherapy, psychology, dentistry and other health related degrees at university. These scholarships help Indigenous students to overcome barriers to tertiary study and qualification.



Rural Medical and Nursing Scholarships

Australian Rotary Health provides scholarships for medical and nursing students to undertake placements at a rural and remote health care service. Students experience what these facilities have to offer and provide an incentive for recipients to pursue a career in rural Australia upon graduation.


