ShelterBox **QUICK UPDATE** Rotary 5 September 2018

29 July & 5 AUGUST 2018 LOMBOK EARTHQUAKE

SRT TEAM ACCESSING

Following the earthquake Two SHELTERBOX ResponseTeam highly trained Volunteers, including Dave Hallett from Canada, went to assess the situation on the ground.

They worked closely with local Rotary contacts and liaised with national authorities to understand whether and how we can help families affected by the disasters. There are 20,000 people without a home.

TRADITIONALLY INDONESIA does not allow outside agencies to work in the country unless there has been a declaration of emergency, as you may have read in Rotary Out West.

NO REQUEST

The Indonesian Government has not requested international assistance but ShelterBox is able to respond because of our **Project Partnership with Rotary International**. Because of this partnership we are able to send aid, pre-positioned in Jakarta, to Lombok to be distributed through the local Rotary club.

Five Rotarians from Bali have been working together with five from Jakarta and ten from Lombok. They have established a base camp in Mataram.

STORAGE

As you probably know we have Shelterboxes and ShelterKits stored in about 20 places around the world including Jakarta

AID DISPATCHED

The first of our pre-positioned aid from Jakarta was dispatched for Lombok. From here the aid will be distributed by our local Rotary contacts to ensure it reaches the communities most in need.

CEO Mike Greenslade attached an image of one of his friends and colleagues from ShelterBox Canada, Dave Hallett, working with Lombok Rotary (75% of whom are female).



Here's the latest Lombok information as at 5th September 2018

- The SRT members are continuing to coordinate with Rotary and the Government to obtain the beneficiary data, and also to allocate distributions for the next few days.
- On Thursday, 30th August 2018, the team distributed to 70 households, with 600 households planned in total.
- The state of regional emergency has been declared over by the Government but the team does not think this reflects the actual need and the Government is still happy for us to continue our distributions.
- Team two are going to be heading out to add to the team already in country.
- The team are still working on the logistics for 200 boxes that are being moved from Jakarta to Lombok.
- Australia SRT member and Rotaract Member, Katelyn Winkworth has deployed to join the team in Lombok.
