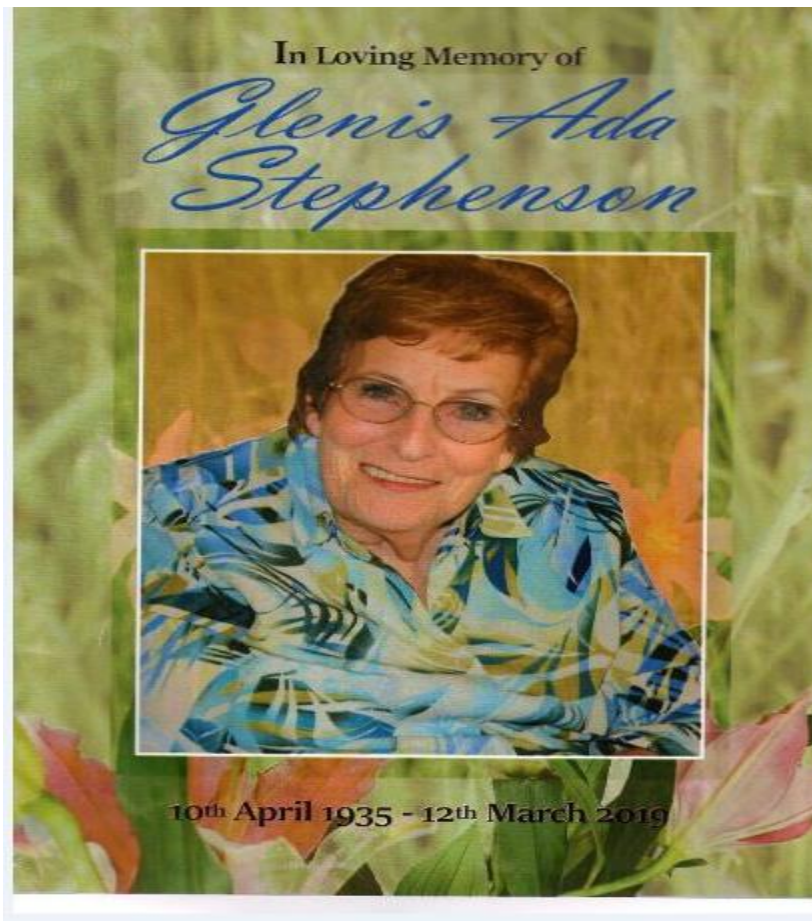

A Tribute and Memories of Glenis Stephenson presented at the Funeral Service by Ascot Past President Mike Bermann.

Glenis Joined Rotary 1991 (Vocational – Real Estate)

Embellished Rotary and what it stood for.

1. Helping people less fortunate than us
2. Networking opportunities
3. Fellowship

Glenis never received a Paul Harris Fellow nor did she hold the position of President of our club. Does that mean she was a bad Rotarian? Quite the opposite - a strong supporter in our club and the community of Belmont. What-ever was required, day or night, Glenis was there. Glenis was also a very strong supporter to "Rotaract", Young men and women aged between 18 – 30 years. As Peter mentioned "If there was a ceremony for "Opening an Envelope" she was there".

In 1996 we as members of our club were given the opportunity to visit Japan whereby the "City of Belmont" has a sister "City of Adachi Ku". A group of us that included Richo's, Rae's, Glenis, Ann and myself joined the party that attended the 10 year celebration.

A few incidences that occurred and I mean a few only that I'll mention (As you know "What happens abroad stays abroad!!)

1. Girls in the baths.
2. Train pushing.

By 1998 the onset of being wheelchair bound Glenis, not being able to attend regular meetings; the club made her an honorary member. To continue to have Rotary in mind Glenis made sure to replace herself at meetings and keep the vocation of Real Estate. Along came her son Jeff. Jeff's first meeting introduction was singing "I'm For Ever Blowing Bubbles". As a young businessman thought "What The!!!!!!!" Don't let mummy down.

Interesting, Glenis was very organised and did think of the future. She also introduced Mike & Robyn Metcalf who owned a Funeral Parlour at the time in the Belmont area – Say No More. That's the networking part of Rotary.

Glenis would attend what meetings she could and was supported by her partner of 34 years -Kevin. One meeting she came to I remember asking her to stand whilst the club said grace. No come back "I can't – I'm in a wheelchair". She pushed herself and stood.

Glenis at the end lived her life thru "Facebook". Whilst a pain to a lot of people, she embellished herself thru that media. Always first to make a positive comment about what was in our weekly bulletin and what the club is doing.

From 1935 to 2019 the important thing to reflect on is the "Dash In-between", which is the way we live our lives. Glenis you lived your life to the fullest and contributed so much.

A beautiful lady full of vigour and determination to the end.

The extra amount of LEGO will go a long way to help the schools LEGO clubs success.

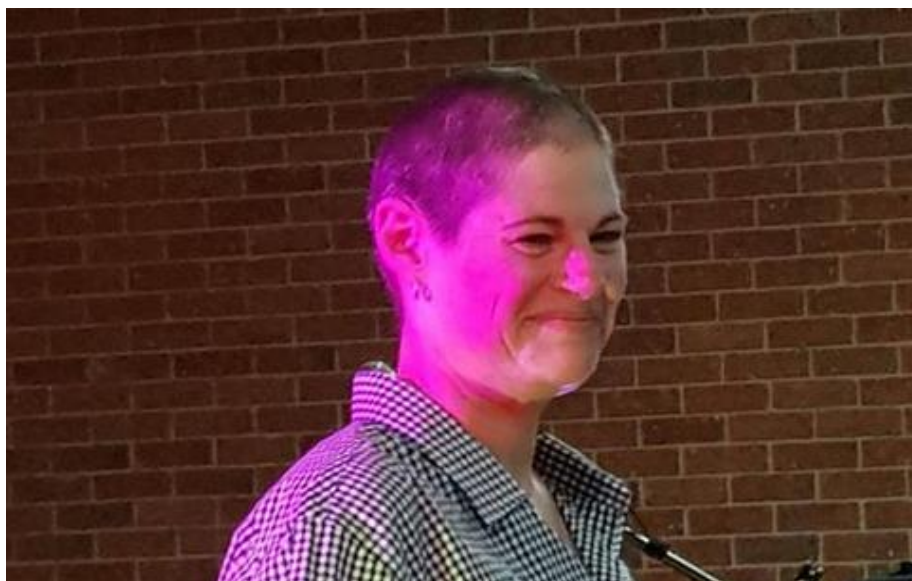
