At this meeting this week we welcomed guest speakers Steve Archibald and Jason King. Steve and Jason spoke about their passion of giving back to the community by raising funds for the Cambodia School Construction Project.

Jason is seeking donations to help change the lives of over 4,000 children living in poverty by sponsoring him in his attempt to break two Guinness World Records.

Cambodia School Construction Project

Jason is seeking donations to help change the lives of over 4,000 children living in poverty by sponsoring him in his attempt to break two Guinness World Records.

First world record for the most funds raised by running a half marathon (\$13,400)

The second record for breaking the time for a marathon dressed as a swimmer. Yes, he will be wearing budgie smugglers, swim goggles, swim hat and armbands for 21.1km in Perth's Half Marathon in August.

Why because it is an amazing opportunity to improve the future of generations of children living in poverty in Cambodia.

Alongside an amazing group of 9 other individuals, the 10 of us will be raising over \$100,000 to provide education to a whole village of children, changing their lives forever.

Using this \$100k, alongside the Cambodian Ministry of Education and the amazing charity a Classroom Of Hope, we will fund the construction of a solar powered school in a village that currently does not have any education facilities, in a country that has over a 25% illiterate rate due to war torn years leaving its education system and facilities in tatters.

The school will be completed in 2019 using local businesses, the Cambodian government will be providing jobs by training staff and supplying amenities, the local villagers will provide labour to erect fencing and ground works for the building, the school will provide solar power to the local micro businesses who will pay a premium for the power, the funds raised from solar power will in turn pay for the ongoing sustainability of the school.

Message from Dismantle:

Dear friends and contacts of Dismantle

One of our key program options is [BikeRescue Licensing](#), enabling BikeRescue capacity and sustainable delivery in local areas (often regional and remote) in partnership with local youth networks, schools and youth service providers/agencies.

To support the establishment and implementation of a BikeRescue License with Pilbara Community Services for the Pilbara, we submitted an application for a 2018 Australian Ethical Community Grant.

A Vote for Dismantle is a vote to support at-risk young people in the Pilbara

Our grant application has been shortlisted - we are now 1 of only 35 applications still active, from over 500. With this year's program aligning with last year's when 16 grants were issued, we now have about a 1 in 2 chance of being successful.
