Polio Movie: Rides Like a Girl

Hugh thanked all those who supported the movie and reminded us that with support from the Melinda Gates Foundation, over \$US 1.8 Billion, has been provided to help reduce the polio numbers previously from 550,000 cases in 150 countries to 78 cases in 2 countries today. It is hoped the disease can be eliminated entirely in the future.

Past District Governor Phil Cordery introduced Joseph Cadzow and his father Jeff. Joseph will be going to Japan on exchange for 4-8 weeks and a Japanese student will stay with the Cadzow family for 5 weeks in March 2020. Bricktober Volunteers

Ann Bermann is seeking more volunteers to support the Bricktober Event this year. If you know of any person who would make a suitable volunteer, please contact Ann.

The following procedure in preparing the volunteers for their tasks are:

- On arrival volunteers must sign in and out.
This is a requirement as part of insurance and risk management.
- Volunteers must specify that they have no reason not to be working with children and have no criminal conviction.
- Volunteers then move to their designated area and should be wearing a blue Bricktober polo shirt.
- Volunteers are to contact Mike Bermann or Ann if there are any problems,
- Please note that Stephen and Joanna Kendall are exhibitors and not to be contacted to deal with problems.
- A Bricktober Lounge will be available for volunteers for their rotational break Roster and Ron Alexander with his team will fill in while people have their break.
- An emergency siren will go off if there is a fire alarm. This will not be a rehearsal and people should move outside to the designated muster point or evacuation area.
During any emergency, volunteers, requested to take only the cash boxes with them and turn any power points off. No one can return to the area until emergency services have given the all clear.
- Those in charge of the Brick-Pit need to be watching to ensure children don't swallow small pieces of Lego.
- On arrival children will be given a wristband with a name and phone number.
- When you have received information of where you will be allocated, you will be given details of where to park.
Those attending the Friday 11th October 8 am "bump in" will need to give their car registration for parking on that Friday.
- Please note the importance of lifting correctly with a straight back, however most of the heavy lifting at "bump in" and "bump out" will be done by the scouts.
