Zoom Meetings

Lego Tubs

Michelle is arranging further Lego tubs for the Maida Vale School to cope with increased student demand. Delivery of the tubs to be delivered when the Maida Vale school returns to normal operations Bunning's have offered community groups a gift voucher which Michelle will investigate how much cash it consists of and the limitations on how these vouchers can be spent.

International - Mike Bermann

Timor Leste is at present in lockdown due to the global pandemic. Materials for our existing support project have already been transported up the treacherous road into Lete- Foho ready for when work can resume.

Bricktober

Bricktober is at this stage an ongoing project. Exhibitors will continue to build in readiness for the 10th - 11th of October 2020. However, if conditions remain where large gatherings are banned, the project may have to be cancelled. A significant problem will exist if people have paid money for tickets and then have these refunded. A decision to go ahead with Bricktober or cancel the project will be finalised closer to the end of July or early August.

In the event of a cancellation, Stephen and Joanna are investigating a virtual Lego Display. This could be online for a limited time, and people could donate or pay to view the Lego displays. The revenue from a virtual Lego display would be less than we make from the planned project, but it will keep Lego in the public eye and hopefully ensure a successful project in 2021.

Future Zoom meetings

Hosting the Zoom meetings in the future will be allocated to the Club President, Vice President and President- Elect. The license for these meetings will be given to the Club with the subscription of \$232 for twelve months paid.

Once we have established a successful connection for all Club Members, we hope to be able to conduct our meetings with guest speakers invited to the Zoom platform.

It is advisable to create a ZOOM account, to do this click on the following link and follow the prompts.

If you wish to initiate/host a meeting, then you will need to have a ZOOM account however if you merely wish to join a meeting then you do not have to have a ZOOM account.

To enter a ZOOM meeting whether you have a ZOOM account or not the following procedure needs to be followed;

- You will receive an e-mail invitation to a ZOOM meeting
- In the body of the e-mail there will be a link, it will look like the following

https://us04web.zoom.us/j/178999479

- Click on the link
- The link should take you to the meeting after the Zoom application is installed, you may need
 to enter the meeting ID number (example 178 999 479) the number will be included in the email invitation, simply insert the number into the required field and enter.
- You will see a pop up "join with computer audio", click on it and you should be in the meeting
- You will see a menu, it will either be at the top or bottom of your screen, you will need to click on the "start/stop video" button
- You then be in the meeting with vision and audio

ZOOM meetings can be accessed by laptop, ipad, tablet, smart phone or PC, laptops, smart phones, ipad's and tablets have built in cameras and microphones if you are using a PC you will have to have a web camera, if you haven't got one you can purchase one at JB HIFI or a similar outlet, the last time I looked they were about \$50.00.
