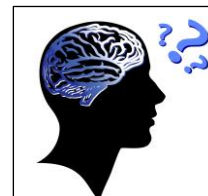

YOUTH EXCHANGE



Our club has received the following by the District Youth Exchange chair, Ross Grafton for consideration:-

Basically; Ascot is being approached to part host an incoming exchange student, the student would spend six months with Ascot and six months with the RC Esperance.

This may be a way for our club to re-engage in the Youth Exchange Program without having the encumbrance of having to host a student for the full twelve month exchange period.

I know that we have got a few members who are passionate about the program but it has been an issue getting enough host families for the full twelve months, this way we would only need; say two or three host families over the 6 month period.

Before moving forward and agreeing to this type of exchange we need to confirm the following:

1. Names of families wishing to host.
2. Once we have the names, we need to discuss with either "Ursula Frayne College" and or "Belmont College" if they would be willing to take on a student for the short period.
3. If so which 6 month would suit?

The overall advantage to this type of arrangement is that the student would get to experience both city and country life during their exchange. From indication given the first 6 months (ie July to December would be spent down in Esperance). This leaves a short period of schooling before returning home overseas.

As you see a few issues need to be sorted out before a full commitment is made.
