Outreach worker support

Starick's outreach worker supports women and children in the community who have escaped family and domestic violence in the following ways:

Assisting with safety planning

- Liaison with services such as income support, health and education services
- Help with accessing support groups and other community services
- Support if client need to attend court or access other legal services

Safe at Home Program – Speaker Nicolle Ruppelle

Starick's Safe at Home program is designed to help women and children experiencing domestic or family violence to stay safely in their homes after separation from their abuser.

Starick's Safe at Home program is available to any woman living in Starick's the catchment area who is experiencing domestic or family violence and wants to remain in her own home.

This includes women with or without children. The service is free, confidential and sensitive to the needs of women from indigenous and all cultural backgrounds.

Starick Safe at Home outreach workers can assist clients in the following ways:

- Carrying out a risk assessment and safety audit of clients home.
- Help with safety planning for the client and their children.
- Upgrading home security.
- Emotional and practical support.
- Looking at other ways to help women and their children stay safe including physical, emotional, financial, and legal needs.
- Providing information and referrals to other avenues of support such as counselling services.
- Advocacy with relevant agencies.
- Court support.
