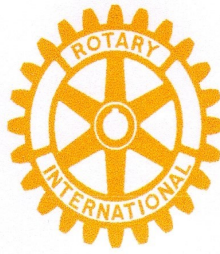

Australian Rotary Health is “Lifting the Lid on Mental Health” and is asking clubs to organize walking events—watch this space for opportunities to get involved.



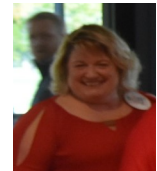
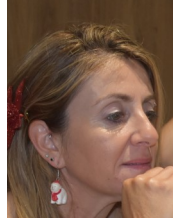


TUESDAY 27 JULY 2021

President Alan chaired his first meeting this morning as a group of committed and keen Rotarians met for our usual breakfast at the Ingot Hotel.

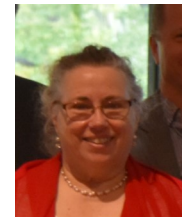
Despite having had a tricky week he did a very good job for his first meeting.

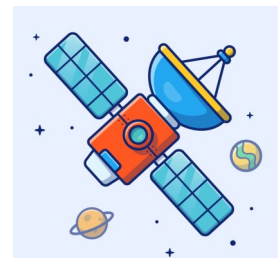
SATELLITE CLUB NEWS:
