A recent project of Kyiv Synergy, Kyiv Capital & Westminster West was the installation of the Rotary Peace Square.

The project was completed on 28th March 2021. In the spring of 2022, Ukrainians in Kyiv planted Pink Apple Blossom Trees which signify Peace. They planted these trees a few weeks after Kyiv was bombed, giving all those who participated in the establishment of the Peace Square, a lot of hope for the future Peace in Ukraine.

Her work has taken her to London, Tasmania & the Pilbara before returning to Perth. She has owned her own metro area Pharmacies, & during that time has been a Member of the Pharmaceutical Society & Guild, serving a term as President of each.

She has spent time mentoring & tutoring Interns to ensure they get the best out of their industry. She has now retired.

Len gave a broad synopsis of the many Regulatory bodies involved in bringing medicines from development to be able to be safely prescribed.

National, State & Administrative bodies have a big & varied input to all facets of providing medicines to keep us healthy.
