Stuart Rutter introduced our Guest Speaker for today, Joseph Cadzow, our recent RYLA attendee.



Joseph addressed the Club on his participation in the RYLA camp earlier this year. In 2019, Joseph visited Japan (Osaka) & attended Primary school, because of the language although he did do some Secondary Classes. He had no knowledge of Japanese & his schoolmates had no English, so he adapted by teaching them English. One of his fondest memories was visiting a Shinto Temple.

The RYLA Camp put together 35 young people, aged between 22 & 24, for 7 days, to promote Leadership Skills. There were 10 males & 25 females.

Activities included:

- Team building
- Values assement
- Building Friendships
- Set Goals
- Listening the importance of listening to listen not to just respond.

The most important lesson was self-awareness, & being able to judge & understand other people, especially through Communication.

President Dianne & Youth Director Stuart Rutter presented Joseph with his RYLA Certificate.

Thank you, Joseph, for a most informative presentation.
