Respectful Relationships Programme in schools

This project is part of an ongoing programme to try and reduce the level of violence towards others in WA. Currently statistics are horrifyingly high at about 1 in 4 women from the age of 15 years and up have been on the receiving end of violence. Children are witnessing this in their environment. We need to invest in breaking this cycle and the Government has provided support to help get this to happen.

The Respectful Relationships Programme which Sara is currently involved in is being run in some 30 primary schools and they hope to increase that to 50 in the not too distant future. The programme will be evaluated by Curtin University, and the preliminary data is showing that it is making a positive difference.

They have a multi step approach, including E-learning, face-to-face workshops and visits to the schools from members of Sara's team. It is all focused on changing the culture in the schools, to be more respectful of others within their school community; and focuses on changing the language used to a more respectful approach. Schools involved so far have been very positive and are 'joining up the dots' to enable their community to know where support can be obtained and how it can be obtained.

There is more work to be done, but it sounds as if this is a great programme.

Thank you Sara for coming and sharing this work with us. We wish your team all the very best and hope that the success you are after will come.
